Background - Explanations

- Survey conducted in pews February 6 and 7, 2010
- Survey total – 877 respondents
 - Adults – 793
 - 509 with No Children aged 18 and below
 - 284 with Children up to age 18
 - High School 84
- High School responses integrated into overall summary graphs
 - High School survey had a subset of the adult survey questions



Points to Keep in Mind

- Many of the questions had responses related to the level of agreement
 - Strongly Agree
 - Somewhat Agree
 - Somewhat Disagree
 - Strongly Disagree
- It is recognized that someone that answered “Somewhat Agree” might not have a strong opinion one way or the other and might see opportunities for improvement
- We intentionally did not include a “neither agree nor disagree” response to try to make respondents either agree or disagree
- You will see a lot of the results stated in terms of percent agreeing which were calculated by combining the “Strongly Agree” and “Somewhat Agree” responses



Points to Keep in Mind

- Well over 1000 comments were received across nearly every question even though only 6 questions were requesting input
 - Over 250 responses to the final comments question
- All comments have been seen by the Fr. Ted, the Planning Council and the Pastoral Council, have been heard and will be considered

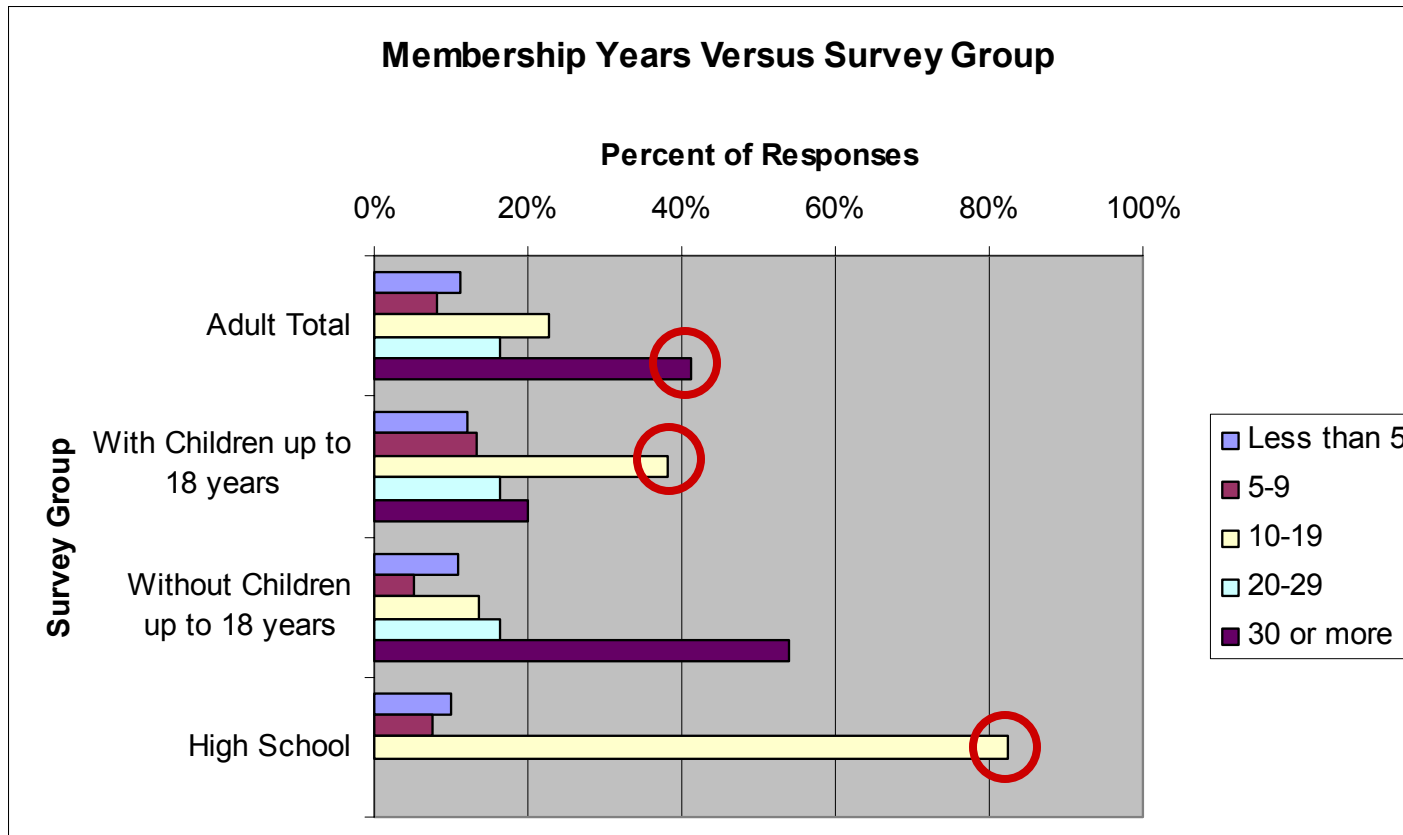

Demographic Questions



1) How many YEARS have you been a member of St. Joan of Arc parish?

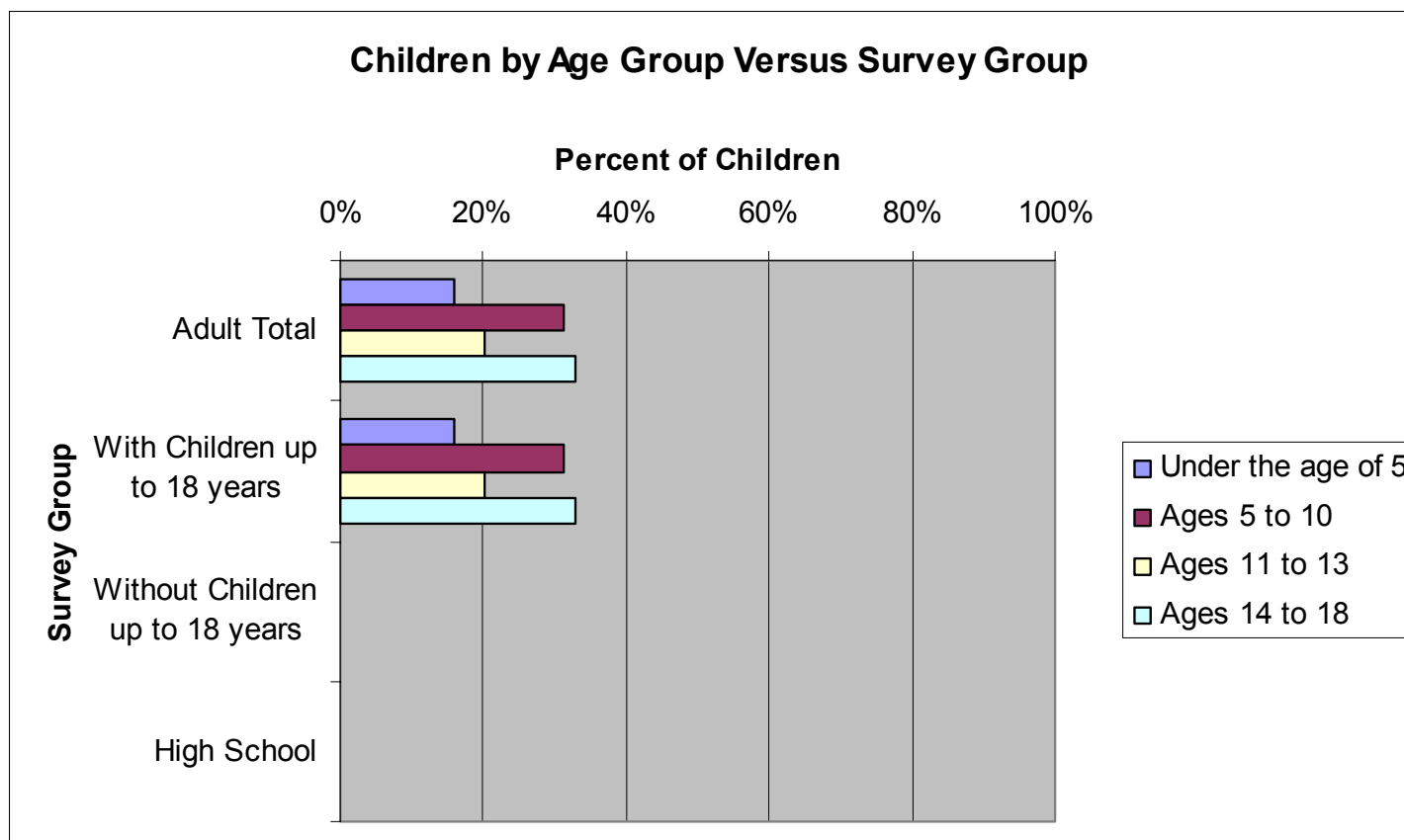


KEY POINTS

- 1) Over 40% of adult respondents have been a member for over 30 years
- 2) About 40% of the adults with children up to age 18 have been a member between 10 and 19 years (Came to town out of college and then had family here??)
- 3) Youth primarily a member for their lifetime



2) How many children do you have at home at this time that are: (show zero or count in each age group)



KEY POINTS

- 1) Nothing significant here
- 2) The larger age grouping bars appear to be due to the number of years covered by each bar
- 3) For example – the yellow bar for ages 11-13 only covers 3 years whereas the other bars cover 5 years
- 4) You might conclude that the under 5 group is about ½ the size in population



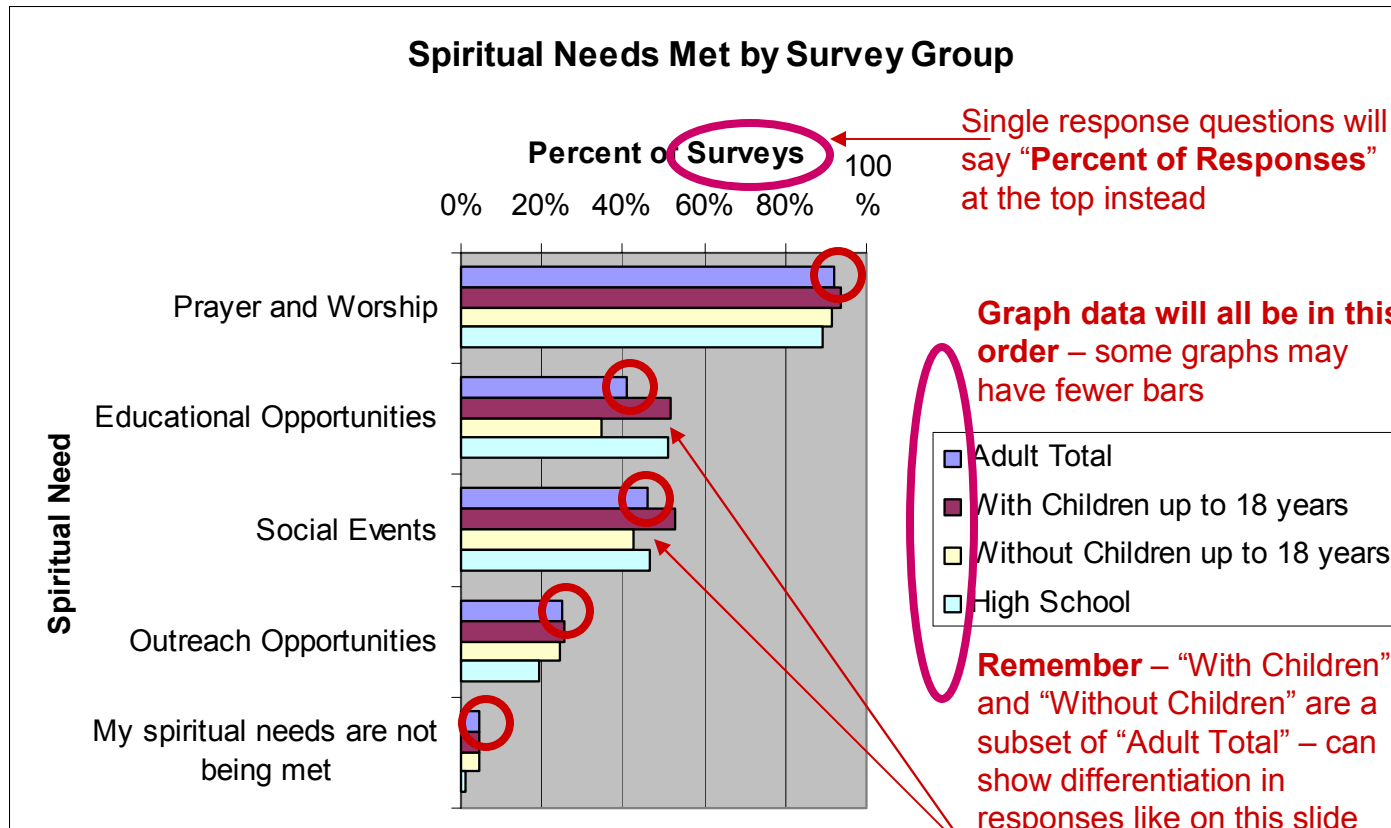

Faith Formation Questions



3) My spiritual needs are met in the following areas at St. Joan of Arc (Select all that apply):

KEY POINTS



- 1) 92% indicate that their spiritual needs are met by prayer and worship
- 2) 46% by social events
- 3) 41% by educational opportunities
- 4) 25% by outreach opportunities
- 5) Only 4% indicated that their spiritual needs were not being met
- 6) The High School responses were in a similar range with only 1% indicating their spiritual needs were not being met

Graph data will all be in this order – some graphs may have fewer bars

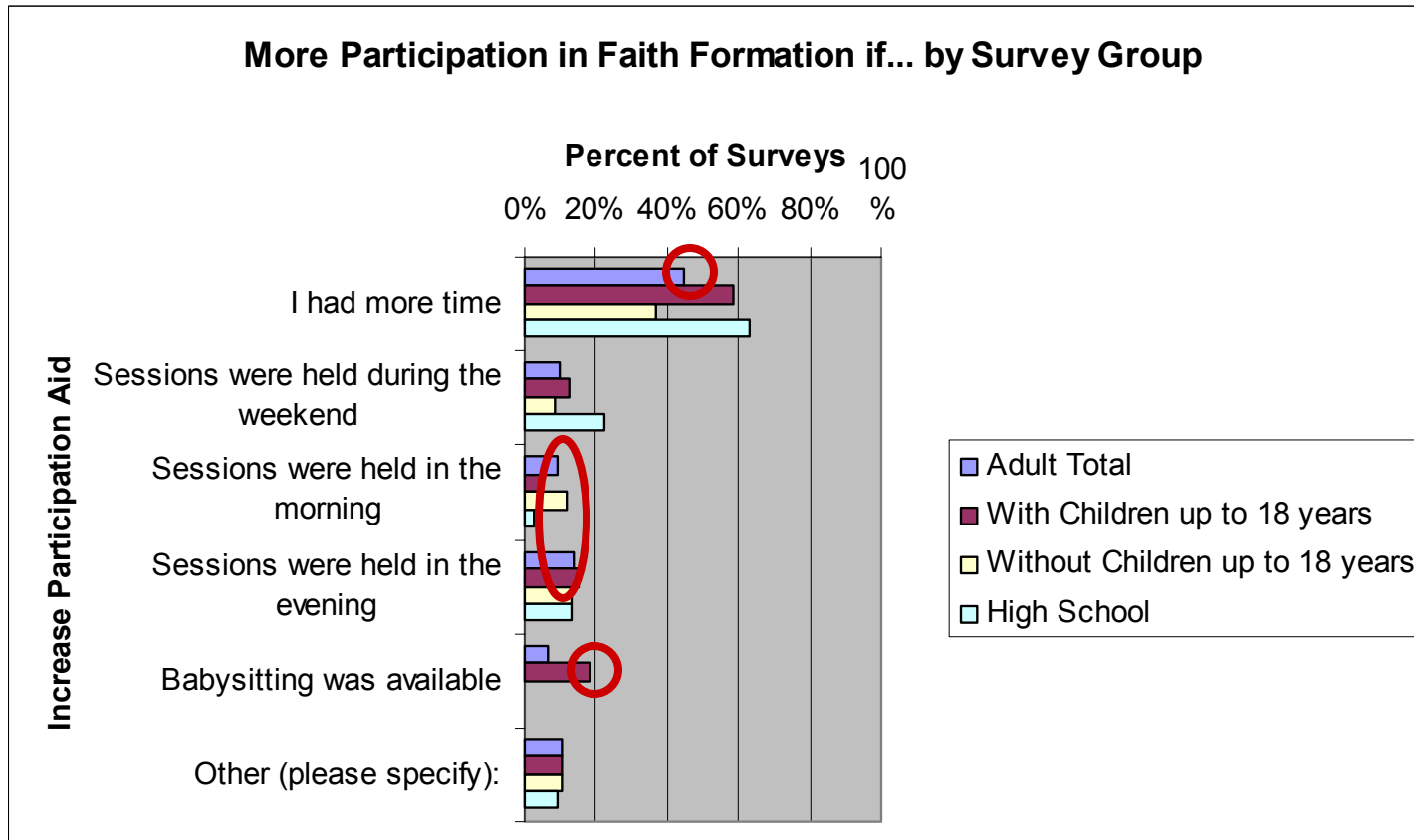
Remember – "With Children" and "Without Children" are a subset of "Adult Total" – can show differentiation in responses like on this slide

4) I would participate more in Faith Formation opportunities if (Select all that apply):

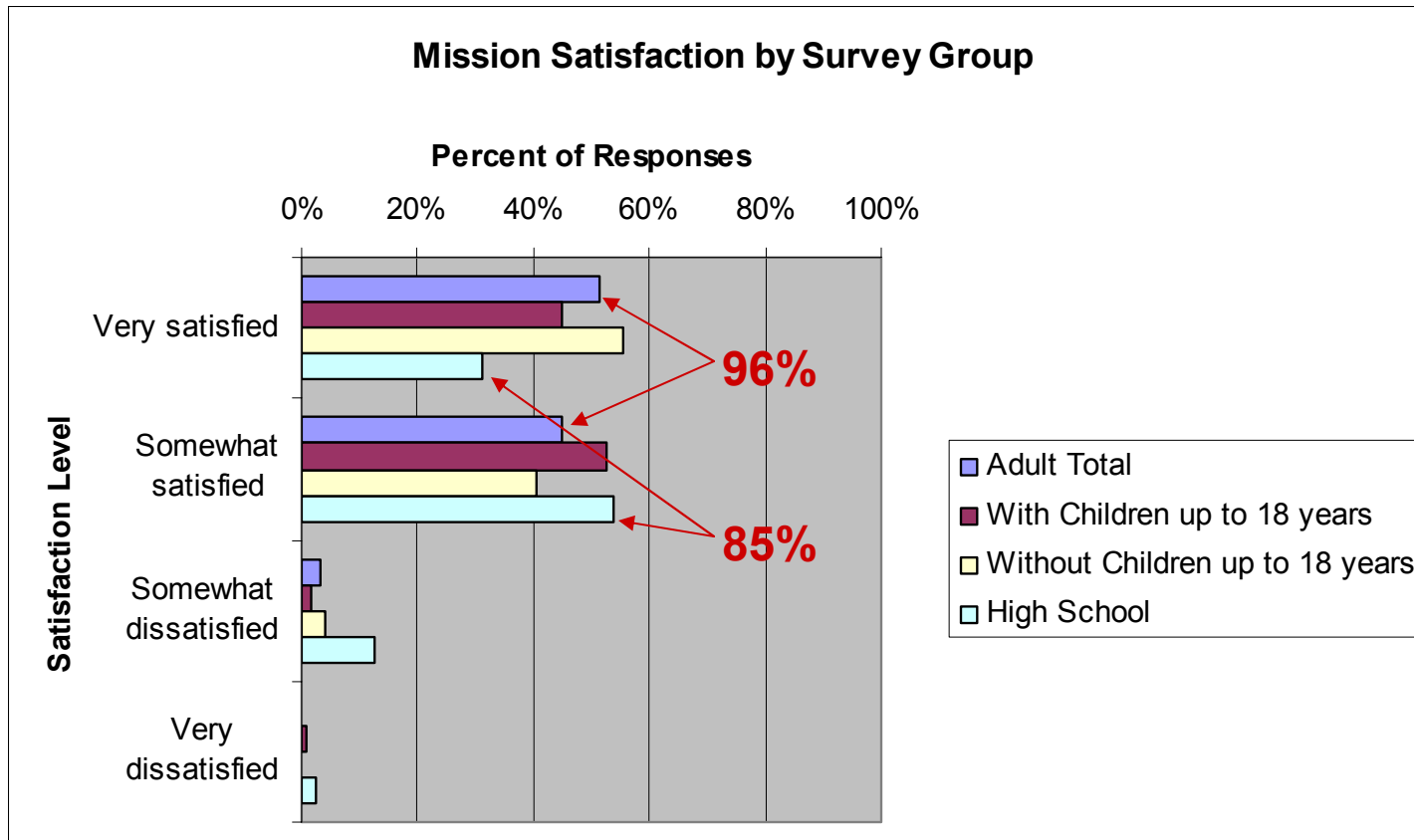
KEY POINTS



- 1) 45% said they would participate in more Faith Formation opportunities if they had more time
- 2) 18% of those with children up to age 18 would like to have babysitting to participate more
- 3) Note that sessions are available in the morning and evening even though a combined 23% said they would participate more if they were available in the morning or evening
- 4) Of those indicating Other – 36 had to do with lack of interest, 25 with time, 12 with health and 3 with transportation



5) How satisfied are you with our missions (speakers, timing, topics, etc.)?

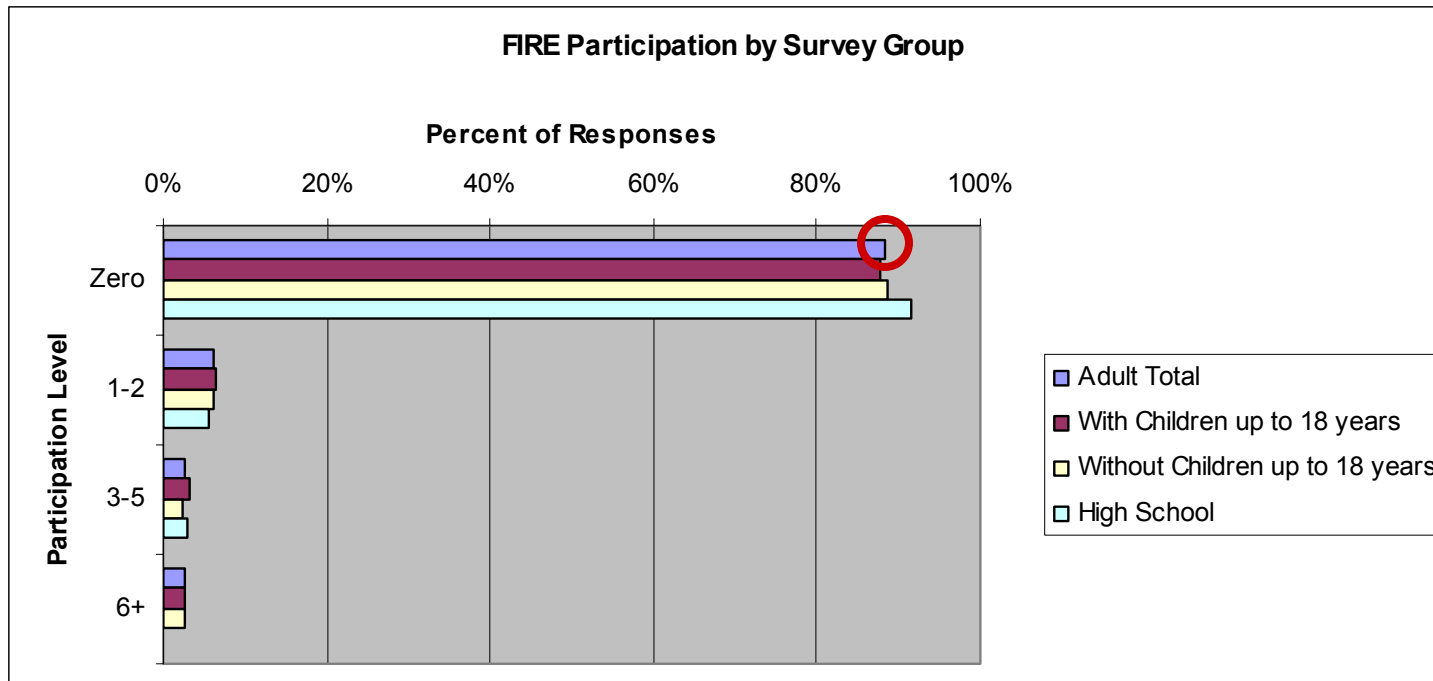


KEY POINTS

- 1) Combining adult overall total of Very Satisfied and Somewhat Satisfied indicates that 96% are satisfied
- 2) Youth overall satisfaction level is 85%
- 3) This means that 4% of adults and 15% of High School respondents are not satisfied with the missions



6) How many FIRE programs have you attended?

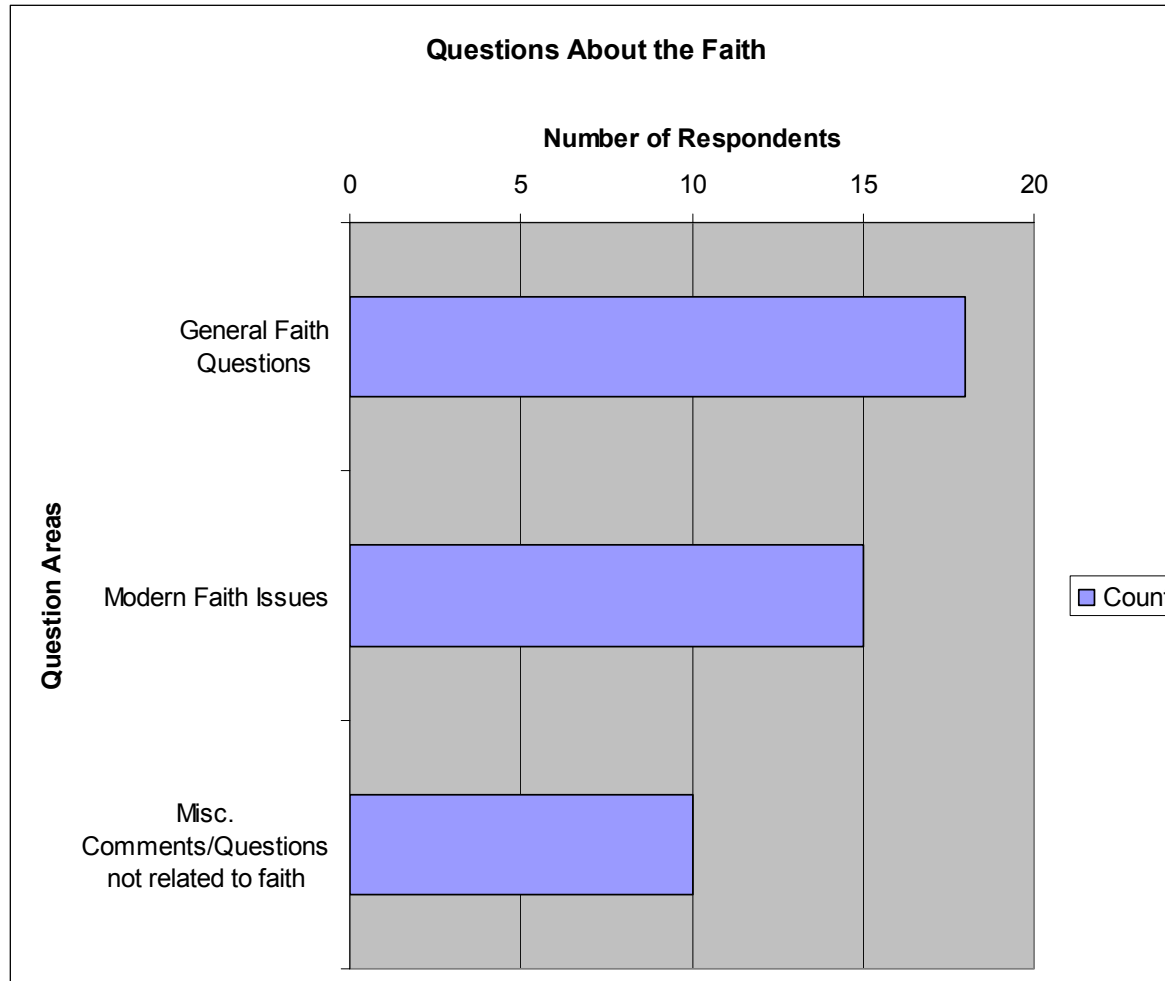


KEY POINTS

- 1) About 90% of adults and High School students responding have not participated in a FIRE program. 10% have.



7) Please list any questions about the Catholic faith that you would like to have answered.





Faith Formation – Questions About our Faith

- **God:** All-knowing; Destiny; Free Will; Love of God and Others; Holy Trinity and Holy Spirit; Why do we say “He” if God has no gender?
- **Catholic Church:** One, True Church? Are non-Catholics saved? Why can’t women be priests? If married, Anglican priests can become Catholic priests, why can’t our priests marry? Why is fasting required? Isn’t personal sacrifice preferred? How can we have respect for other religions? When and how do we get the new Catechism?
- **Issues with Dying:** Heaven; Hell; Purgatory
- **Bible:** Need for bible study; Tradition versus Bible; Readings at Mass.
- **Issues on the Eucharist:** Real Presence; Can I receive after missing Mass?
- **Current Issues:** Marriage; Family; Homosexuality; Divorce; Annulment; Abortion; In-vitro Fertilization; Embryonic Stem Cell Research; Being an Organ Donor.
- **Apologetics:** Mary’s virginity; Adoration of Mary; Saints; Faith and Works; the Pope; Evolution; Stay true to faith in the modern world.



Faith Formation - Summary

- Parishioners' spiritual needs are primarily being met by prayer and worship
- A very low percentage indicate that their spiritual needs are not being met
- The primary reason for not participating in more Faith Formation opportunities is lack of available time
- 96% of adults and 85% of High Schoolers are satisfied with the Missions
- Only 10% of adults and High School students have participated in a FIRE program

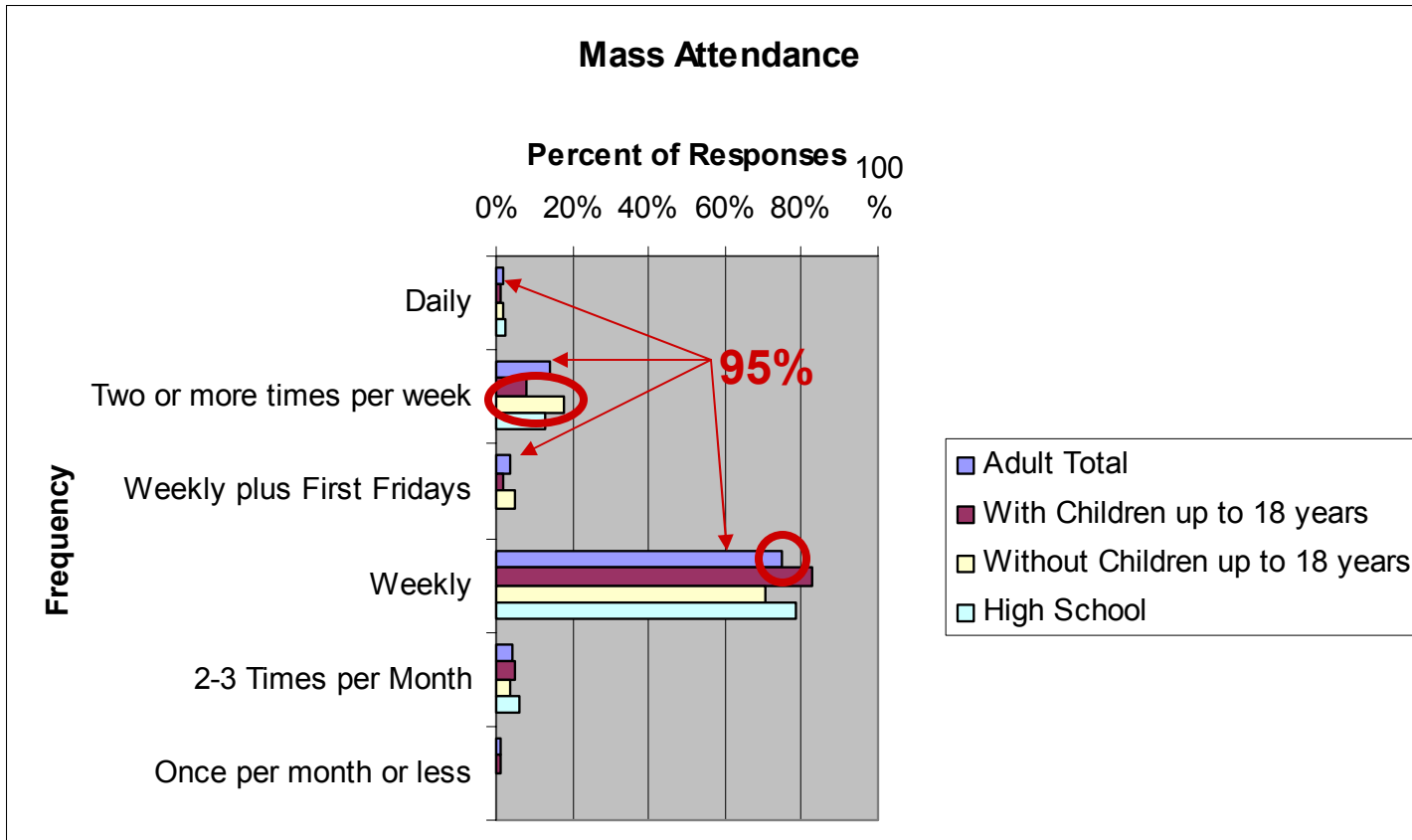

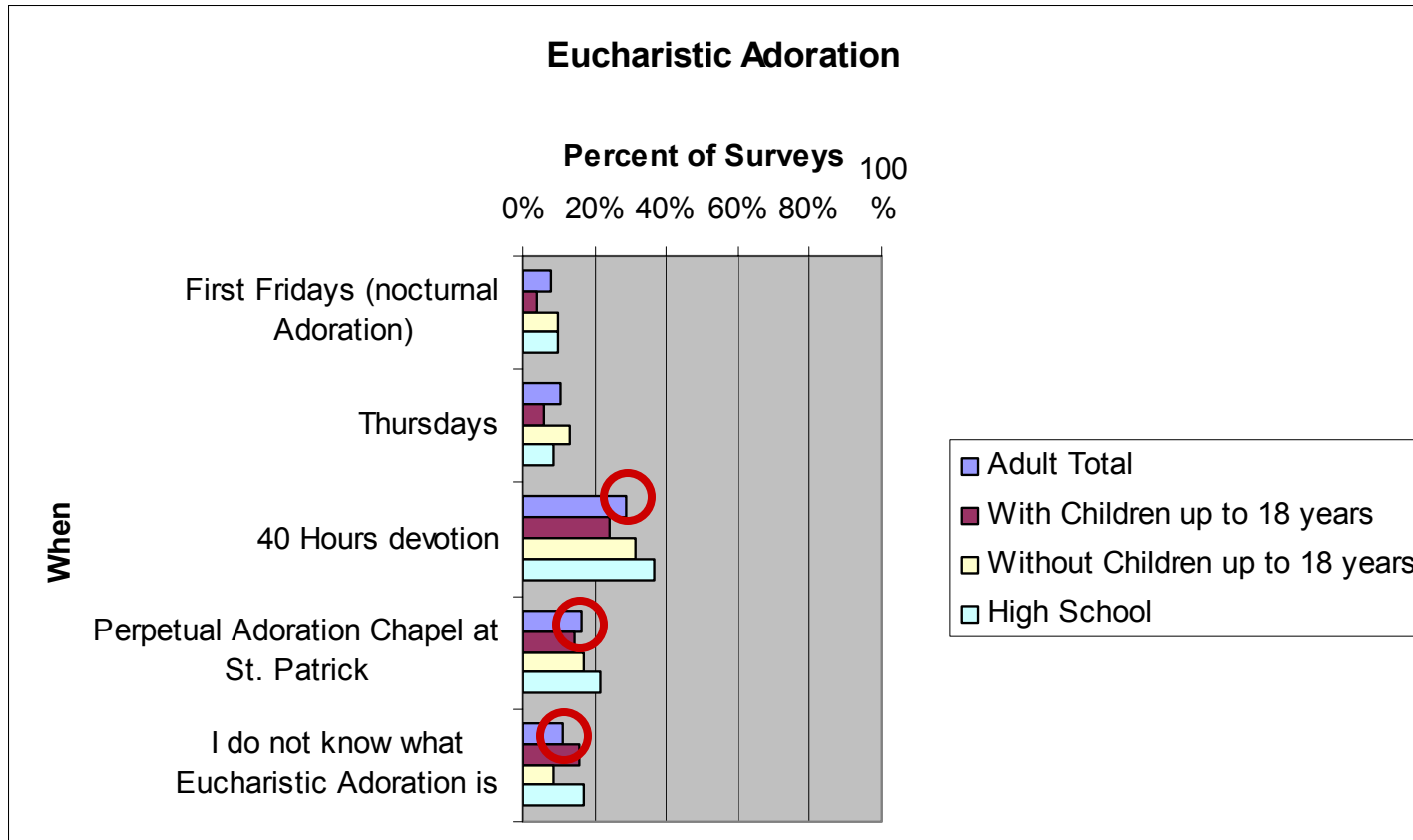


KEY POINTS

- 1) About 80% attend Mass weekly and 95% weekly or more
- 2) Those adults without children 18 or under are more likely to attend more than weekly



9) I participate in Eucharistic Adoration during (Select all that apply):

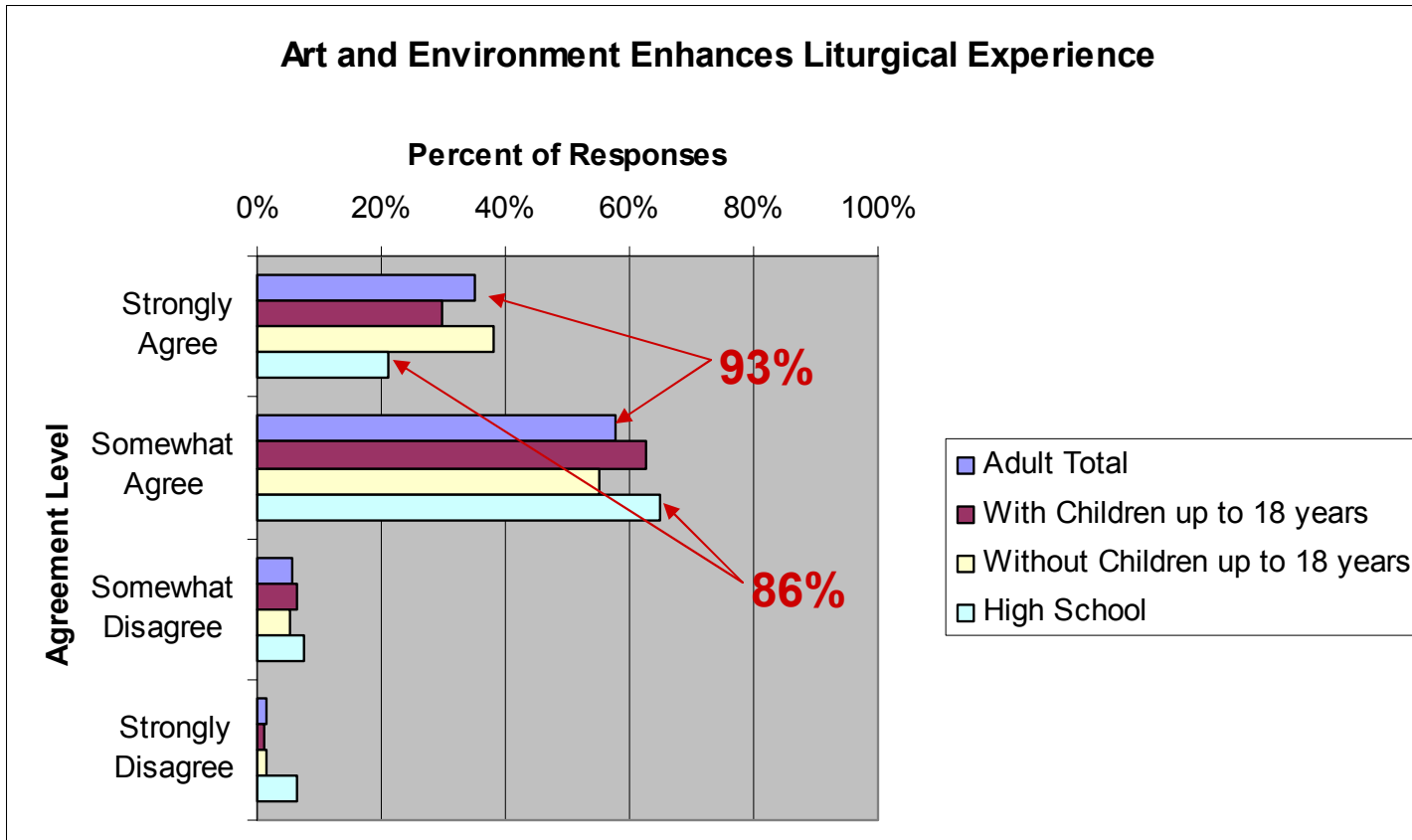


KEY POINTS

- 1) This question was structured in a non-typical way in that a valid response would be to check no box – for example they periodically go to Eucharistic Adoration at other times.
- 2) About 30% of adults and youth attend during 40 Hours devotion and 20% at the Perpetual Adoration Chapel at St. Patrick
- 3) 11% of adults and 17% of High School did not know what Eucharistic Adoration was



10) Throughout the year, the changing art and environment in church enhances the liturgical experience for me.



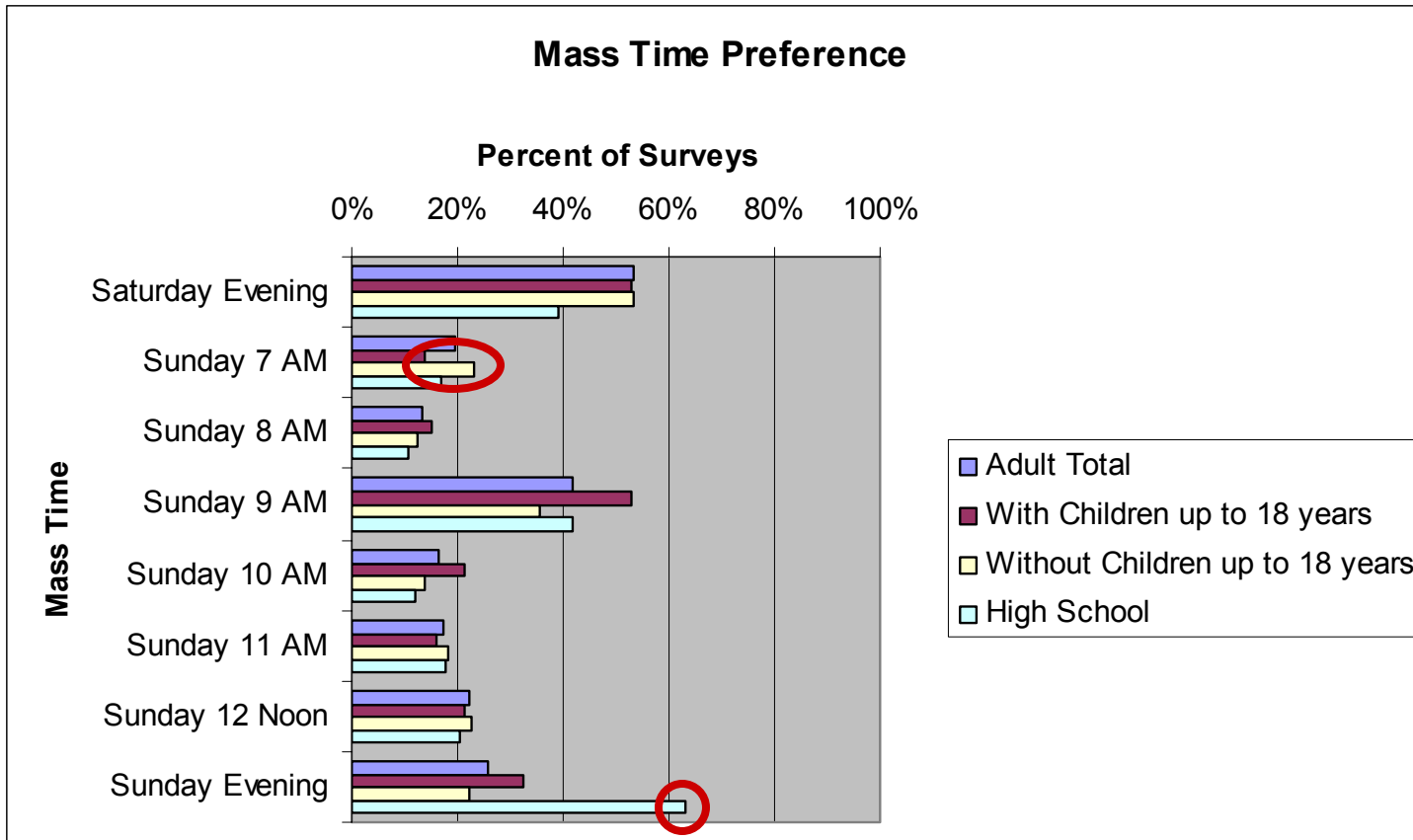
KEY POINTS

- 1) 93% of adults and 86% of High School agree that the art and environment enhances their liturgical experience
- 2) 35% were Strongly Agree



11) What approximate weekend Mass times do you prefer? (Select only 3 times!)

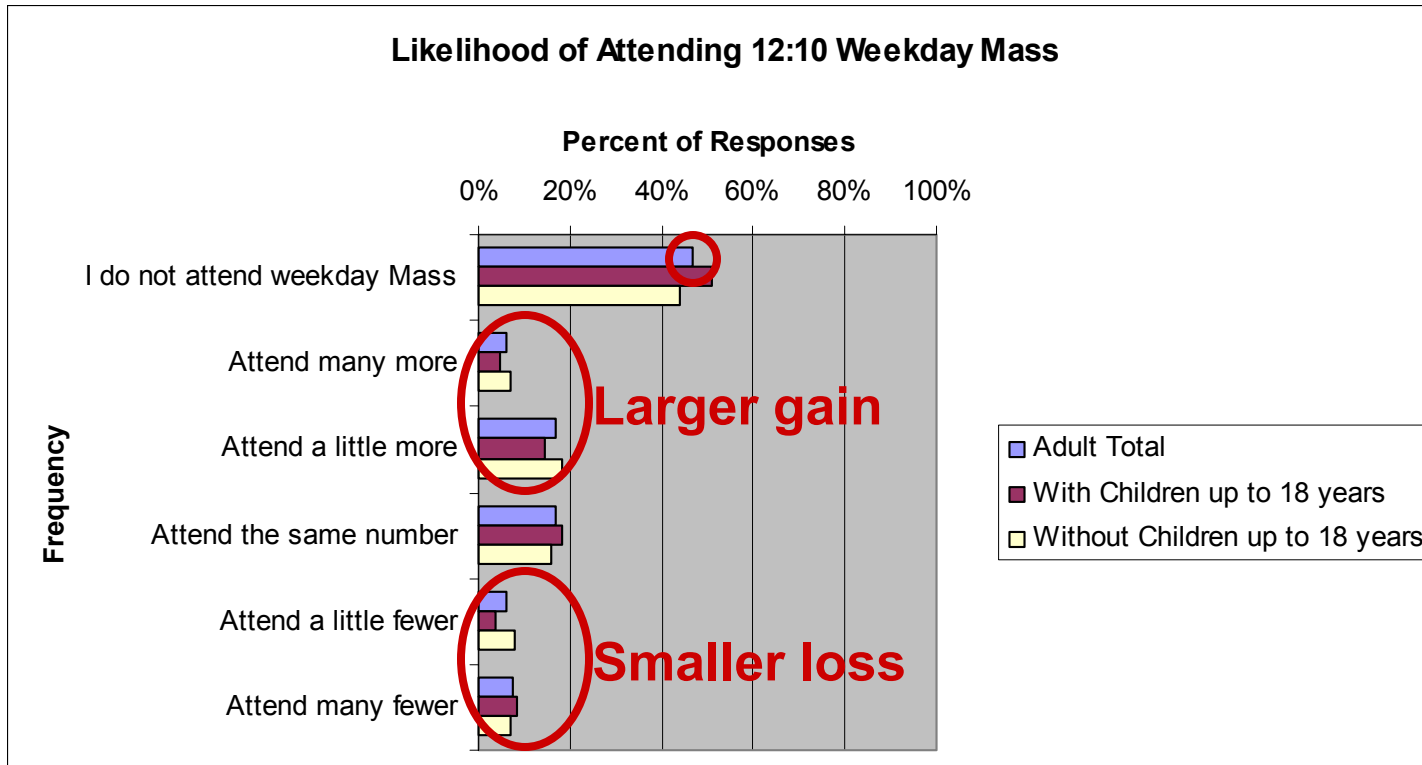
KEY POINTS



- 1) The preferred Mass times are Saturday evening, Sunday at 9 AM and Sunday Evening.
- 2) The combined 7 and 8 AM groups would still be less than the 9 AM total
- 3) Those without children like the early Sunday Mass times more than those with children
- 4) Those with children like the 9AM Mass much more (probably due to Religious Ed)
- 5) The High School children really like the Sunday evening Mass (63%) where they often attend today



12) If weekday Masses were moved from 8:15 AM to 12:10 PM, how would this affect your likelihood of attending weekday Mass?



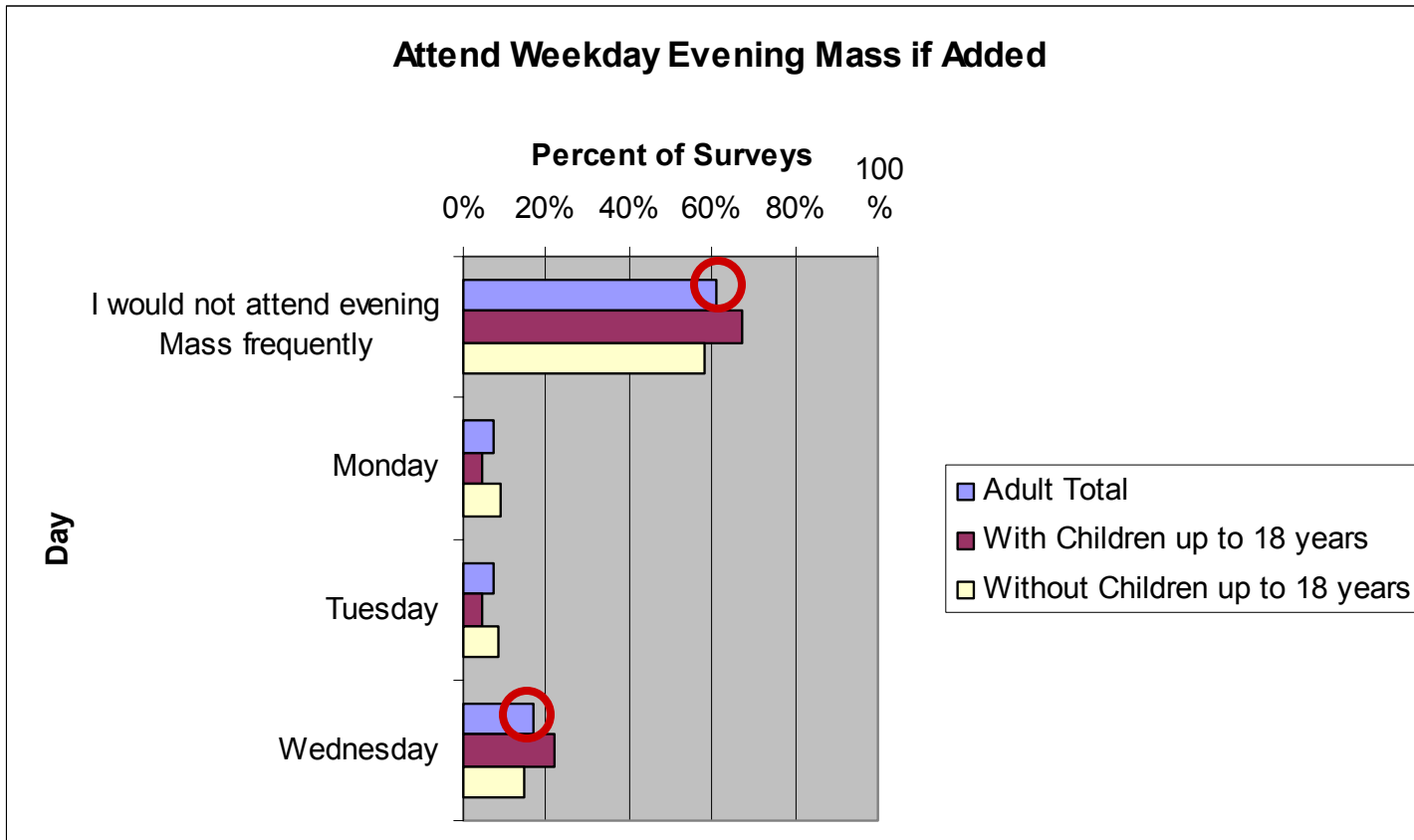
KEY POINTS

- 1) 45% of adults don't attend weekday Mass
- 2) Change of time appears to indicate more would attend but not very significant. You would gain some and lose some.



13) Which weekday evening Masses would you attend if they were added? (Select all that apply)

Attend Weekday Evening Mass if Added



KEY POINTS

- 1) 60% do not frequently attend weekday evening Mass
- 2) 17% indicated that they would attend on Wednesday



Liturgy - Summary

- 95% of respondents attend Mass at least weekly
- 11% of adults and 17% of High School do not know what Eucharistic Adoration is
- 93% of adults and 86% of High School agree that the art and environment enhances their liturgical experience
- The preferred Mass times are Saturday evening, Sunday at 9 AM and Sunday Evening
- Changing daily Mass time to 12:10 showed the potential for a small increase in participation
- 17% indicated that they would attend evening Mass on Wednesday if it were available

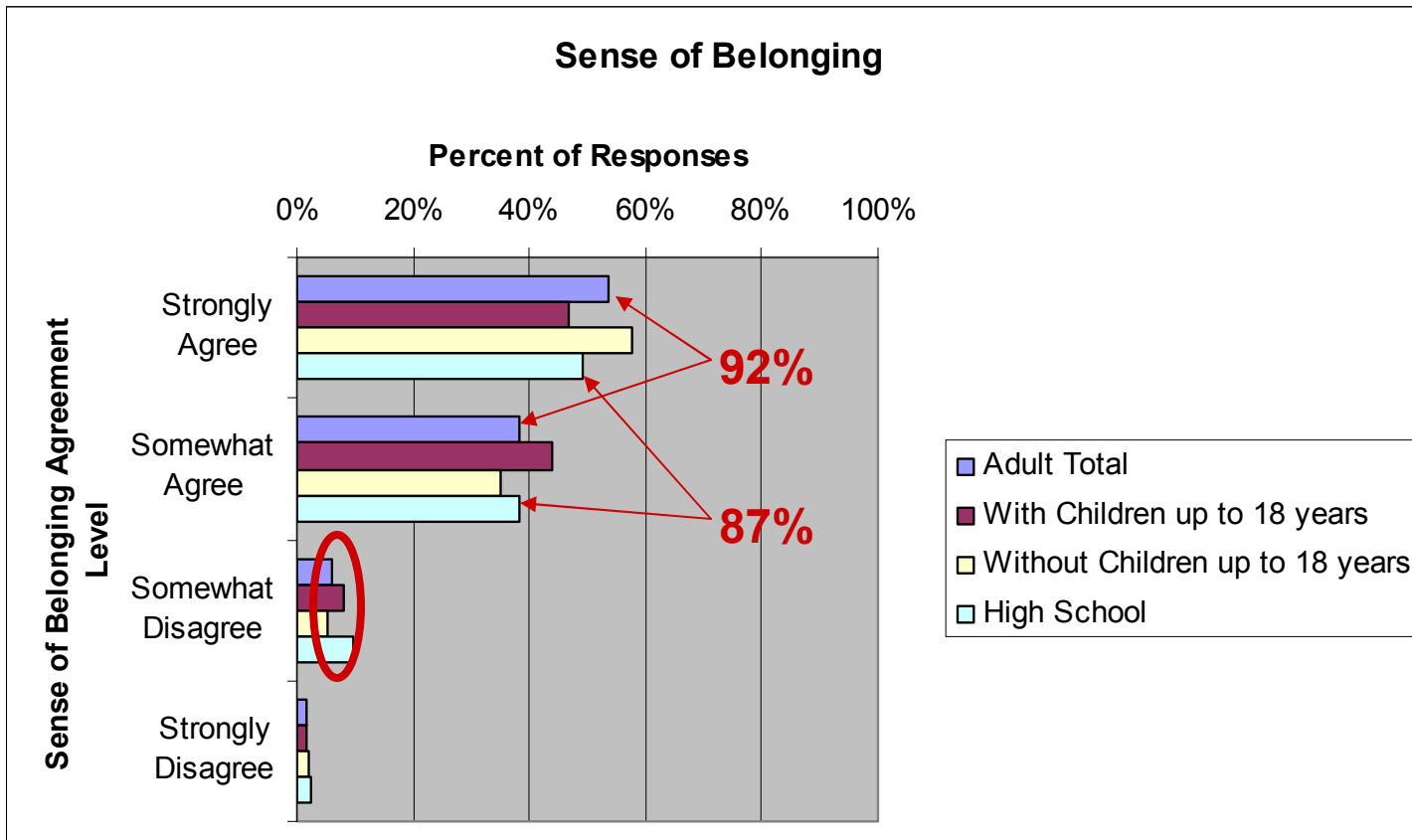

14) I have a sense of belonging at St. Joan of Arc.

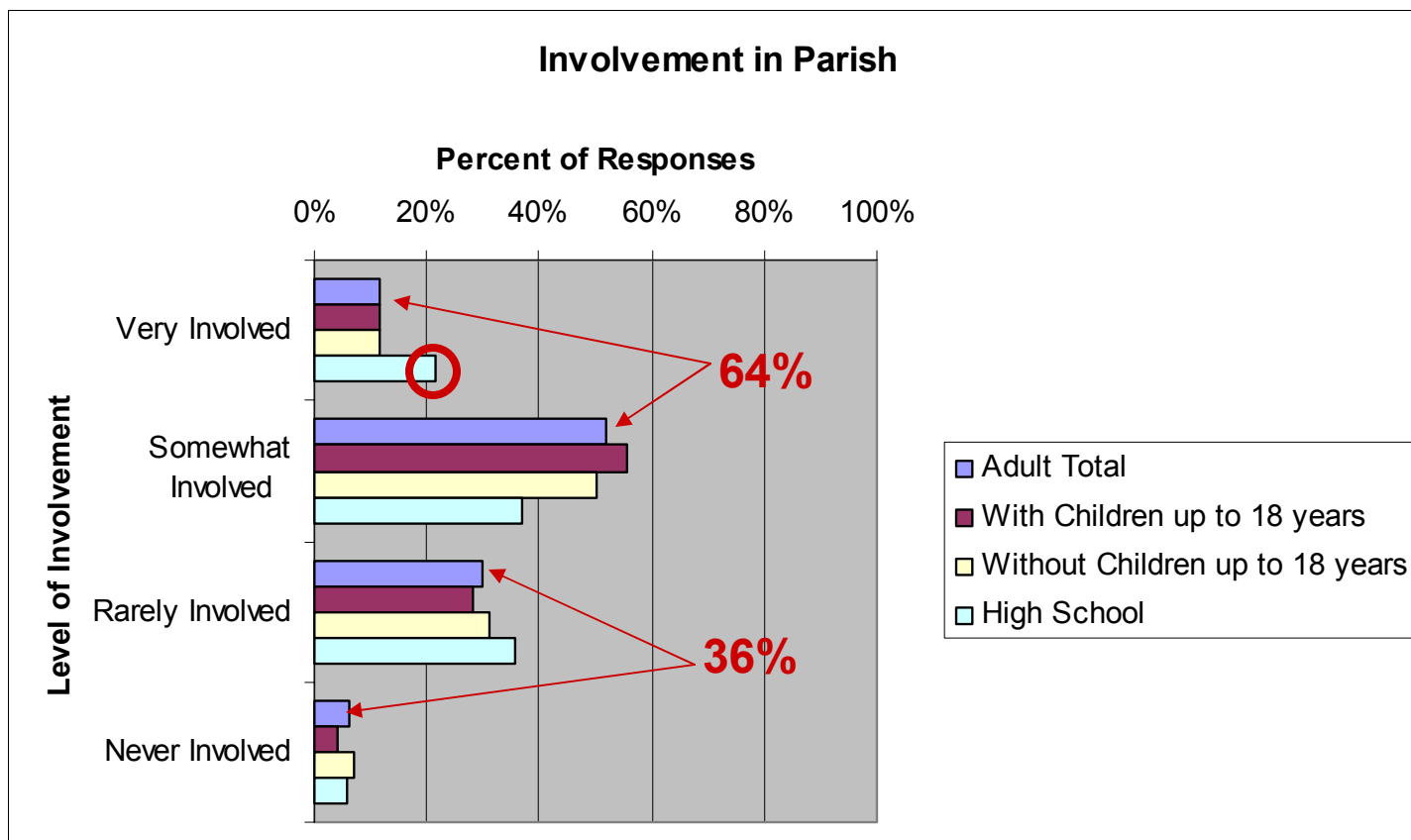


KEY POINTS

- 1) 92% of adults and 87% of High School students have a sense of belonging
- 2) 10% somewhat disagree
- 3) Did not try to correlate this question with how long they were a member of the parish



15) Beyond attending Mass weekly, how do you rate your involvement with the parish community?

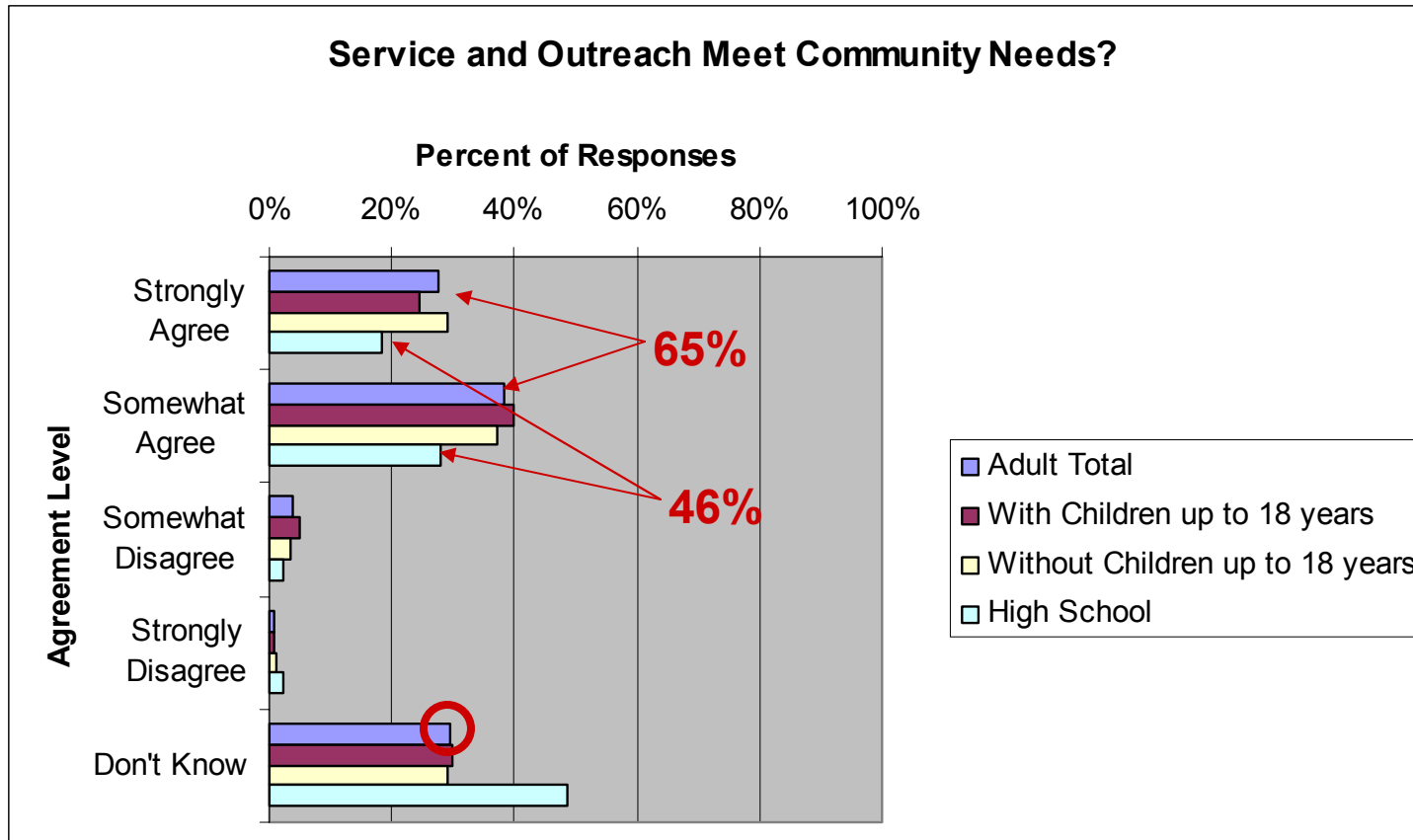


KEY POINTS

- 1) High School 21% Very Involved – almost twice the adult rate of 12%
- 2) Almost 2/3 involved in the parish outside of Mass.
- 3) About 1/3 Rarely or Never Involved



16) Our Service Ministries and Outreach activities meet the needs of our community.

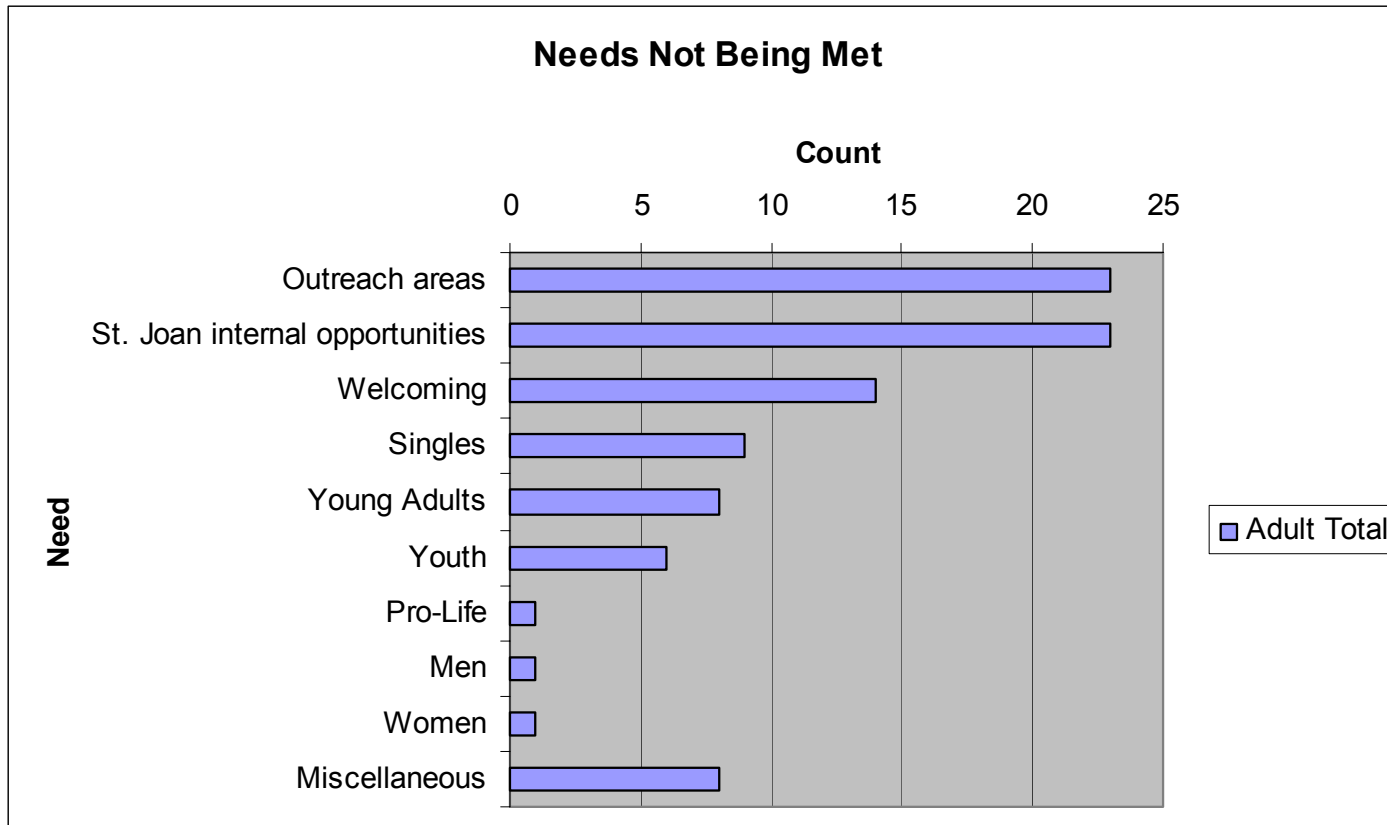


KEY POINTS

- 1) About 65% of adults agree whereas High School less than 50% agree
- 2) 27% Strongly Agree
- 3) 30% Don't Know – High School about 50% Don't Know
- 4) We probably need to communicate more of what our outreach activities are and potentially do more



17) Needs not being met in our parish community are (please describe):

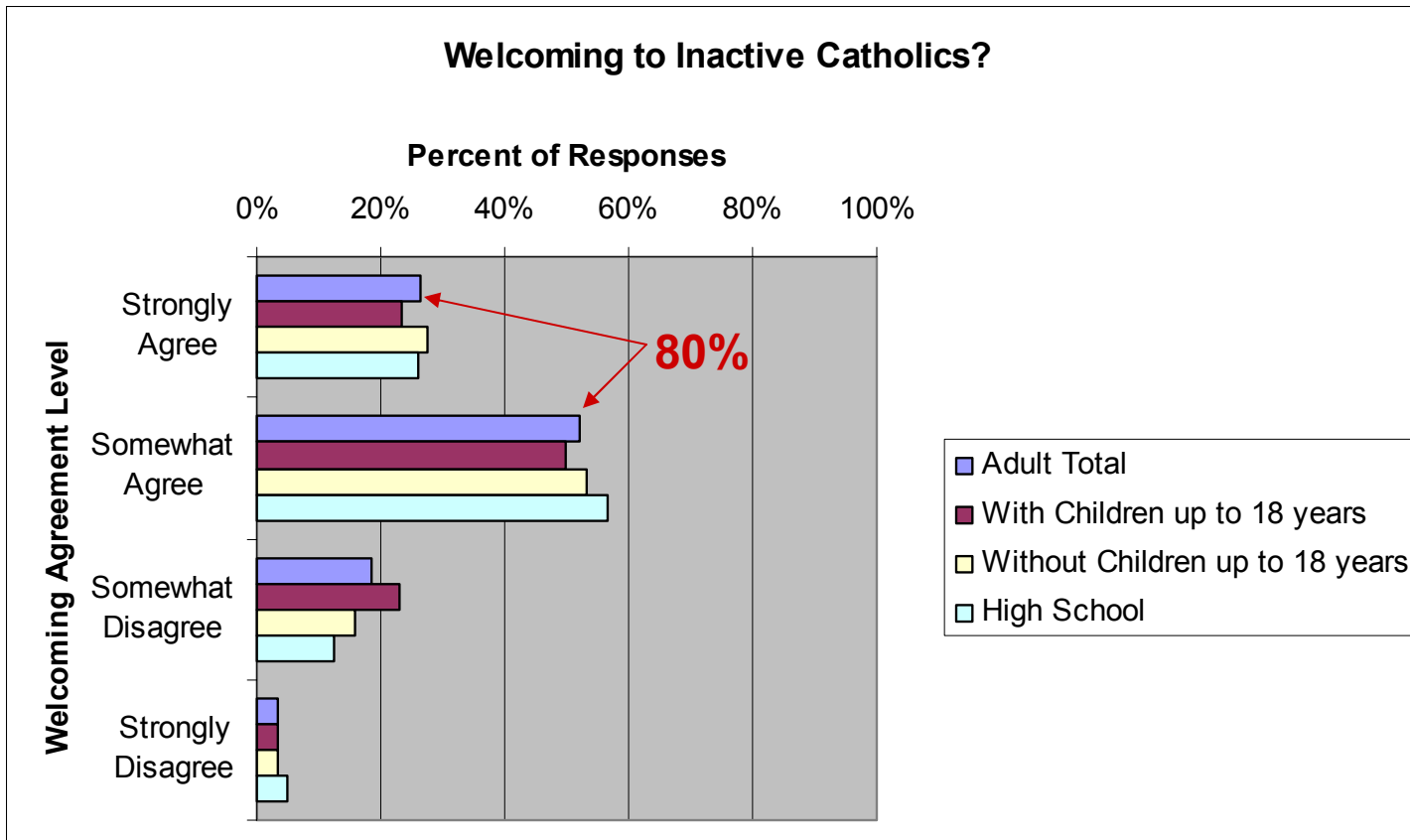


KEY POINTS

- 1) Several areas are not being met
- 2) Need to recognize that the top bars each represent less than 3% of the surveys



18) St. Joan of Arc Parish reaches out to and is welcoming to inactive Catholics in Kokomo.

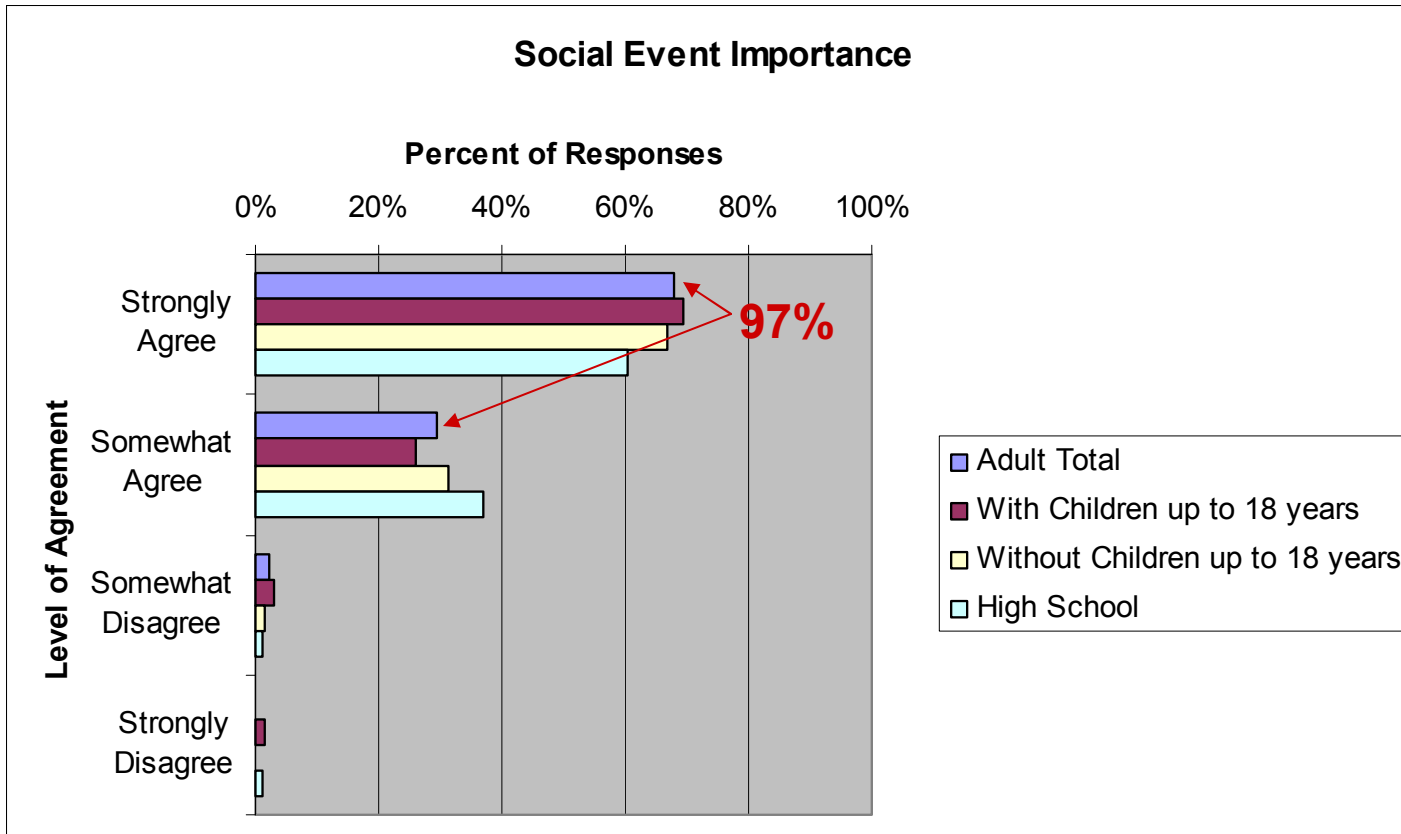


KEY POINTS

- 1) About 80% agree and 20% disagree
- 2) 26% Strongly Agree
- 3) This is an area the Evangelization Council is working



19) Parish social events such as the Parish Festival, Parish Feast Day Celebration, Mothers Day Dinner, Fathers Day Dinner, Coffee and Donuts, etc. are important to the life of the parish.

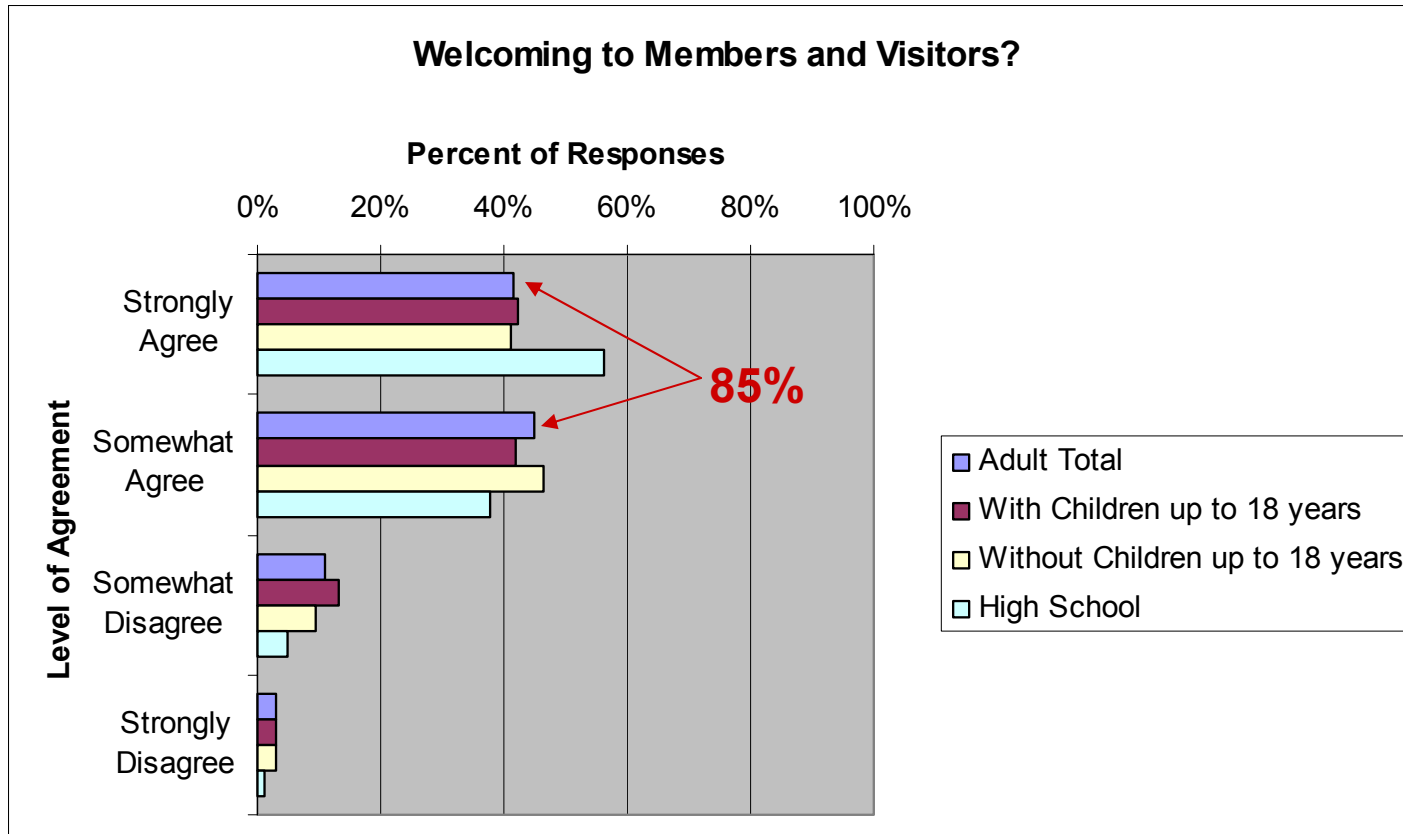


KEY POINTS

- 1) 97% of both the adult and High School respondents agree
- 2) We need to continue these types of events
- 3) About 70% Strongly Agreed



20) St. Joan of Arc is a welcoming parish to its members and visitors.

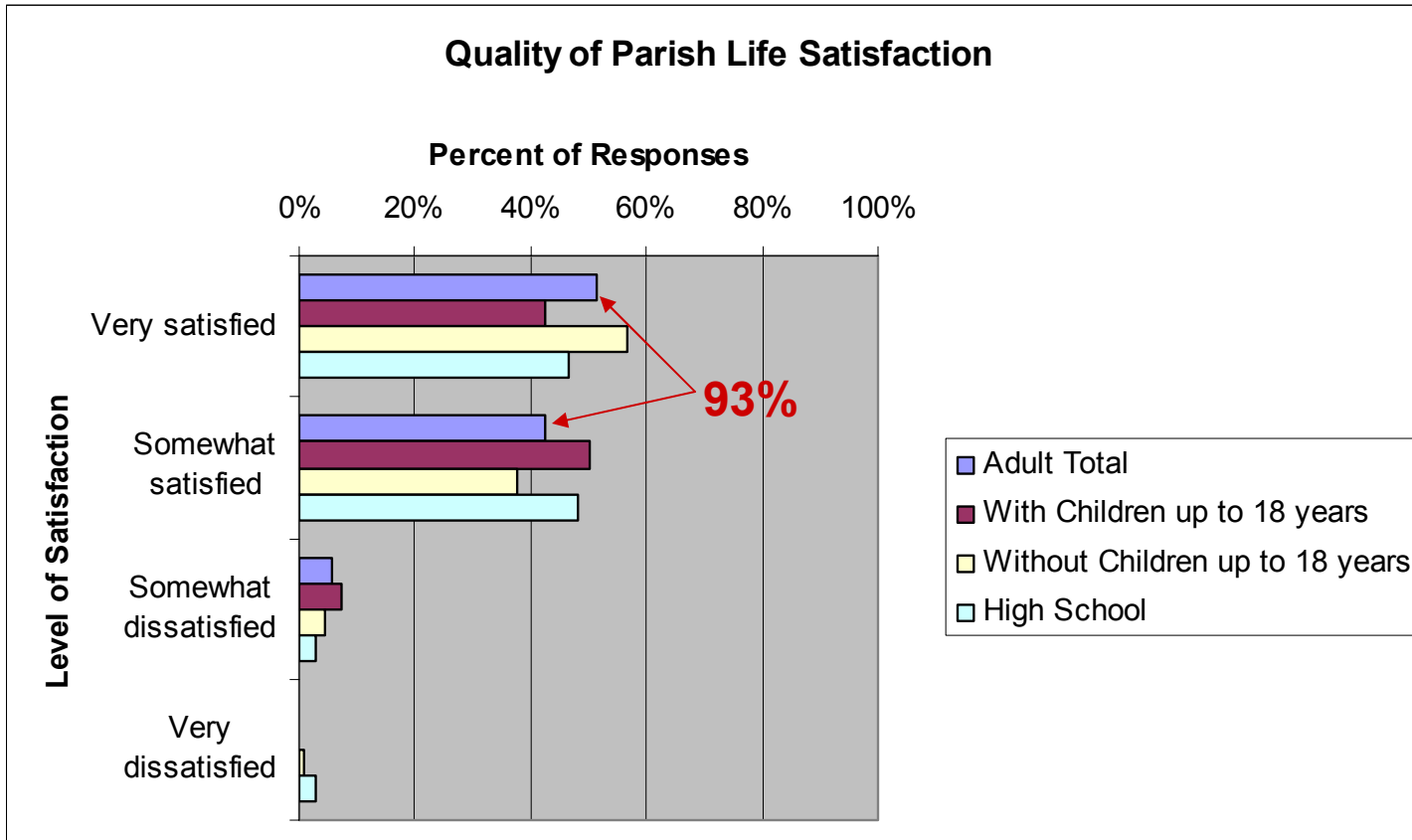


KEY POINTS

- 1) About 85% agree and 15% disagree
- 2) This is being worked by the Welcoming Committee. You may have seen greeters recently as Masses



21) Overall, how satisfied would you say you are with the quality of parish life (ministries, programs, etc.) offered by St. Joan of Arc?

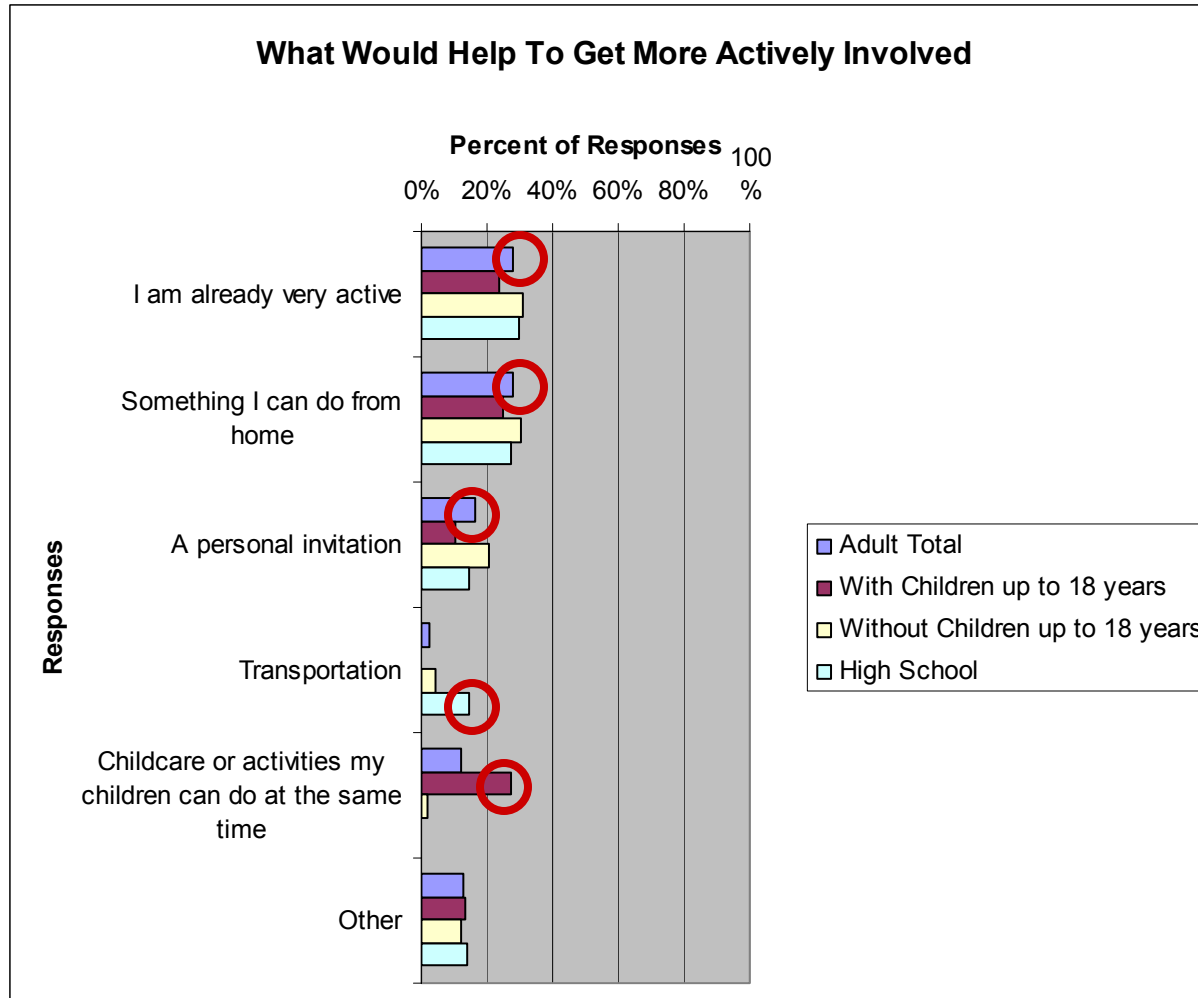


KEY POINTS

- 1) About 10% have not participated in any ministries or programs
- 2) Subtracting these out - About 93% of those that have participated are satisfied



22) What would help you to be more actively involved in St. Joan of Arc's parish life and activities? (Select all that apply)

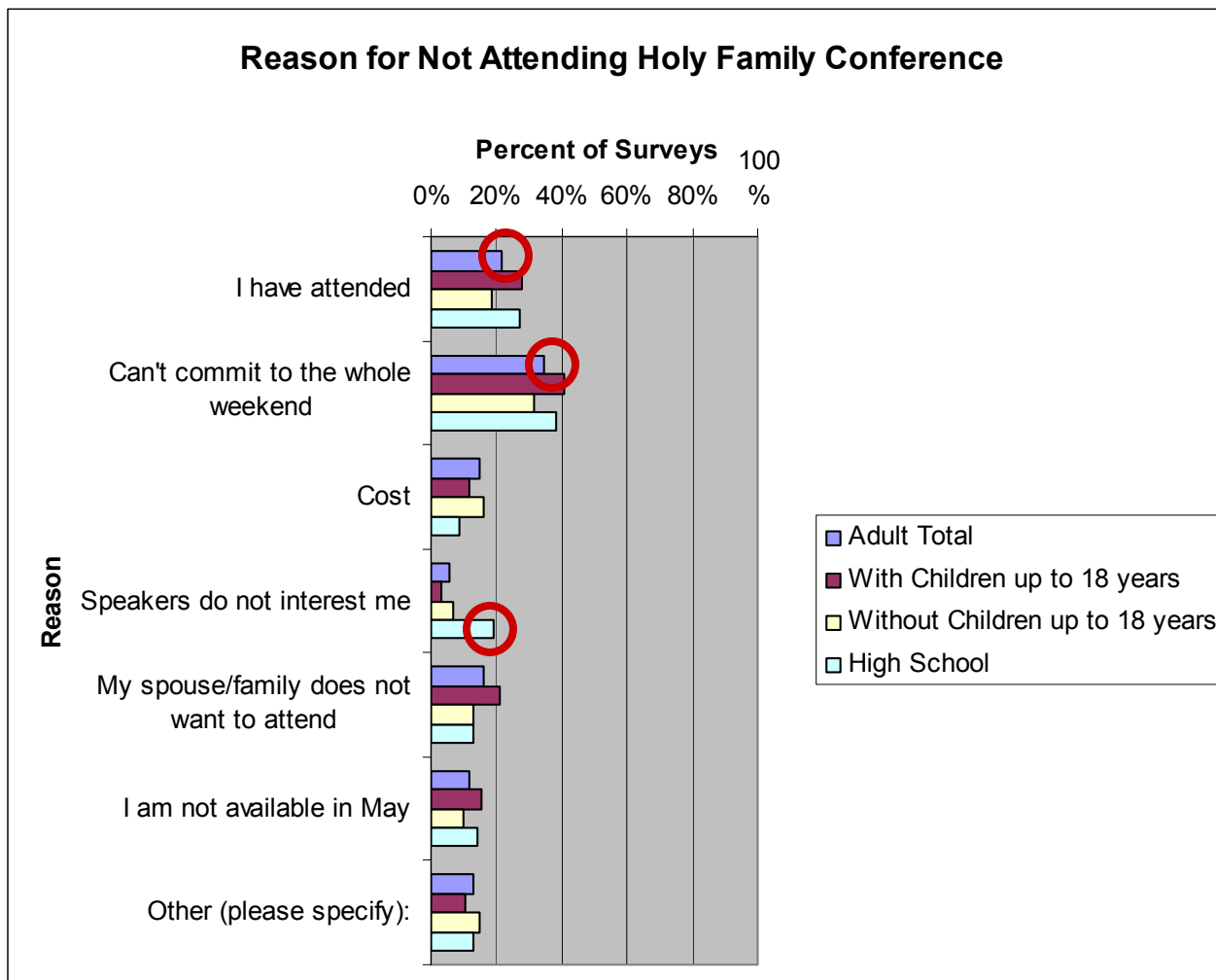


KEY POINTS

- 1) 28% are already very active (note that Q15 indicated only 12% very "involved")
- 2) 16% are still looking for an invitation!
- 3) 28% are looking for something that they can do from home
- 4) 15% of High School respondents need transportation to be more involved
- 5) Almost 30% of those with children would like childcare to be more involved



23) If you have not attended the Holy Family Catholic Conference that is held at Kokomo High School, why not? (Select all that apply!)

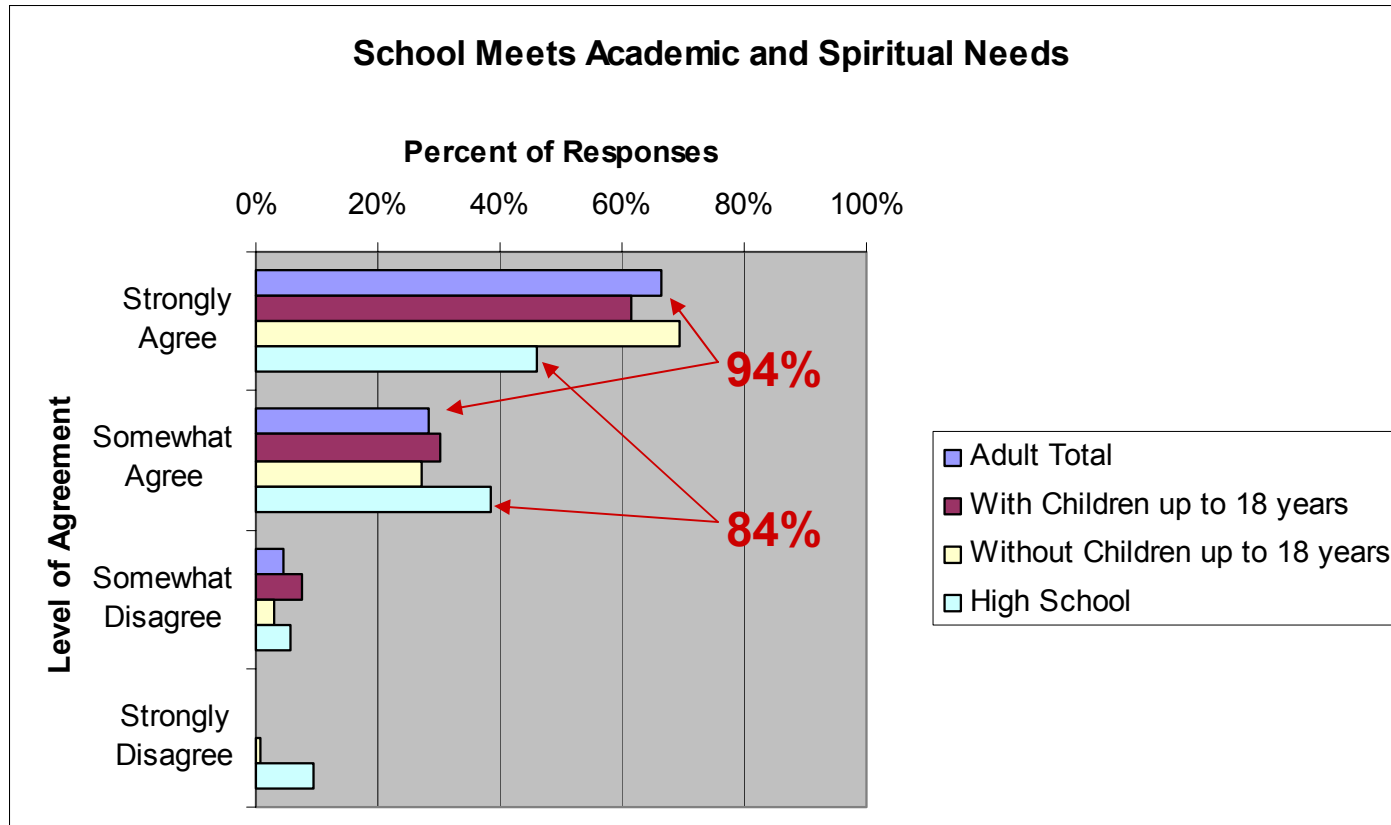


KEY POINTS

- 1) 22% attended
- 2) About 35% can't commit to an entire weekend
- 3) Balance between other responses
- 4) Youth less interested in the speakers



24) Sts. Joan of Arc and Patrick School meets the academic and spiritual needs of its students.



KEY POINTS

- 1) About 20% of adults and 35% of high school students responded that they were not familiar with the school
- 2) Subtracting out that number meaning of those that are familiar, about 94% agree that the school meets the academic and spiritual needs of its students
- 3) The number of High School students that agree is 84%
- 4) The adults have a stronger agreement level than high school students



Parish Life - Summary

- Overwhelming majority (92%) of respondents have a positive sense of belonging
- About 2/3 of respondents involved in parish outside of attending Mass (about 1/2 for High School)
- Increased involvement is possible through:
 - Personal invitation
 - Something parishioners could do from home
 - Lack of time is major impediment for High School students
- Congregation very welcoming to its members and visitors
- Parish social events are very important to parish life



Parish Life – Improvement Areas

- Outreach seemed to be a principle concern
- Items noted:
 - Transportation of handicapped
 - Needs of the poor
 - Visitation and Mass for hospitalized or homebound
- Many were not aware of our outreach methods
 - We may also want to do a better job communicating the various ways that we provide outreach to the community
- Opportunity for more welcoming and involvement of young adults and singles
- Only 22% have attended the Holy Family Catholic Conference (High School was 27%!)
 - Time commitment for an entire weekend is major reason

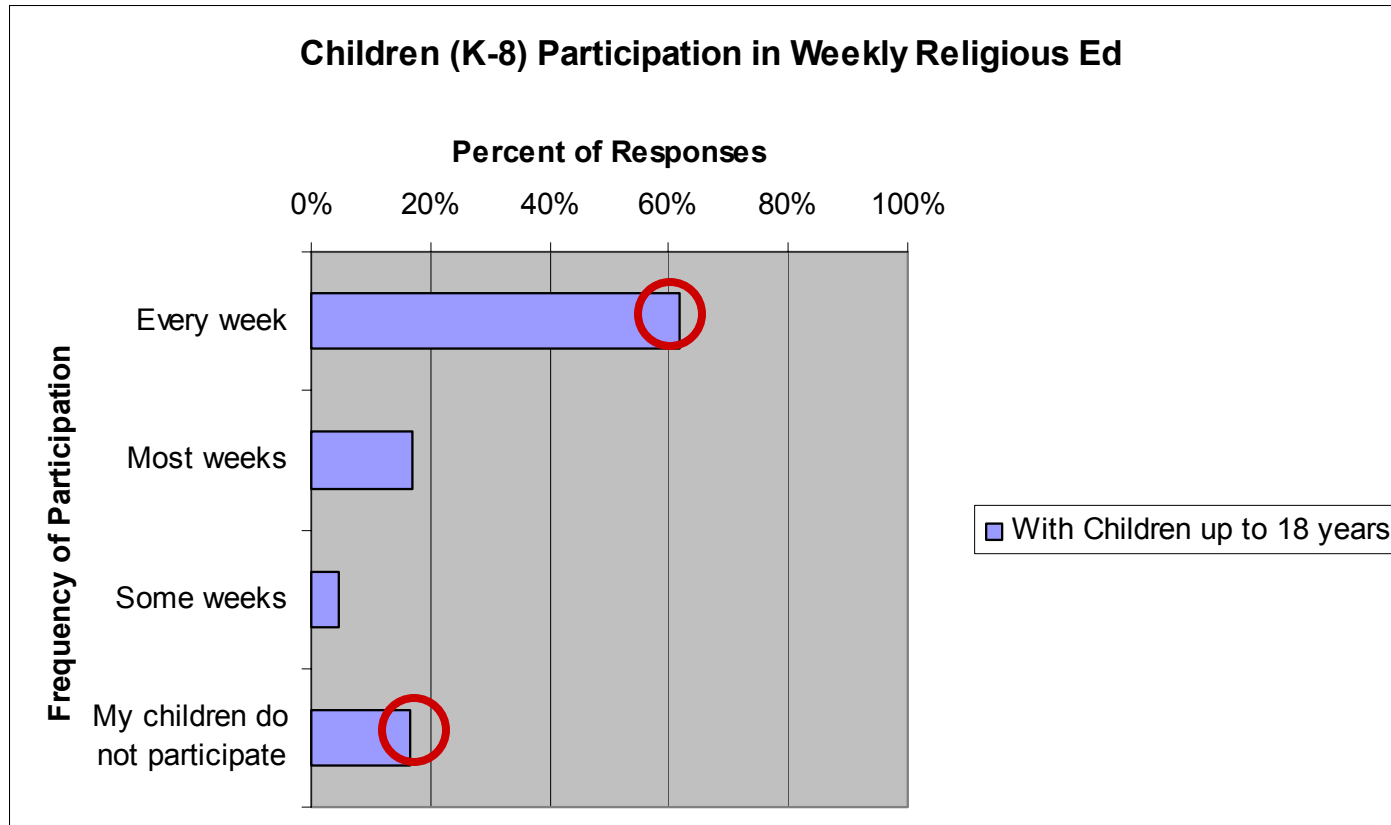

25) My school-aged children participate in the weekly religious education programs.

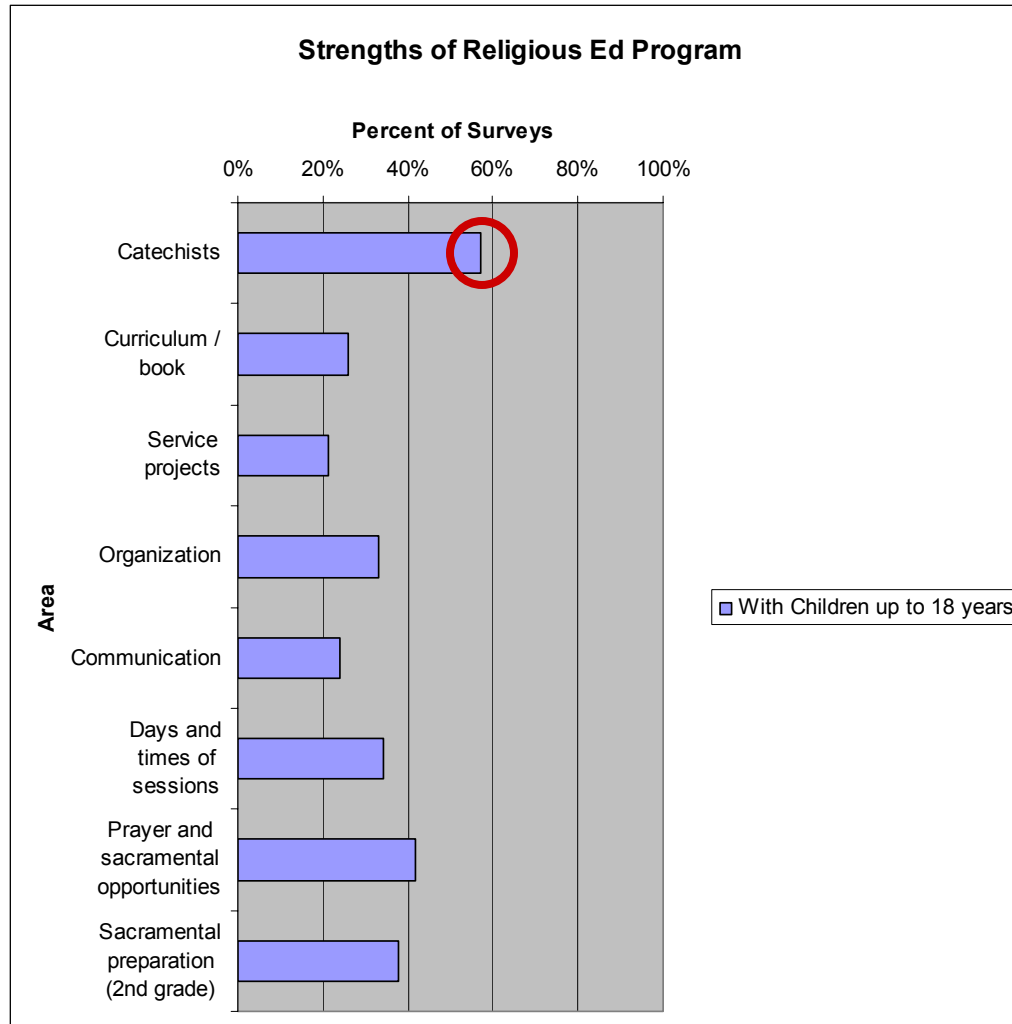


KEY POINTS

- 1) Leaving out those without children this age or that go to our school or are taught religious ed at home – about 62% attend every week and 16% do not participate
- 2) There are some opportunities for improvement here



26) The strengths of our Religious Education program are (select all that apply):

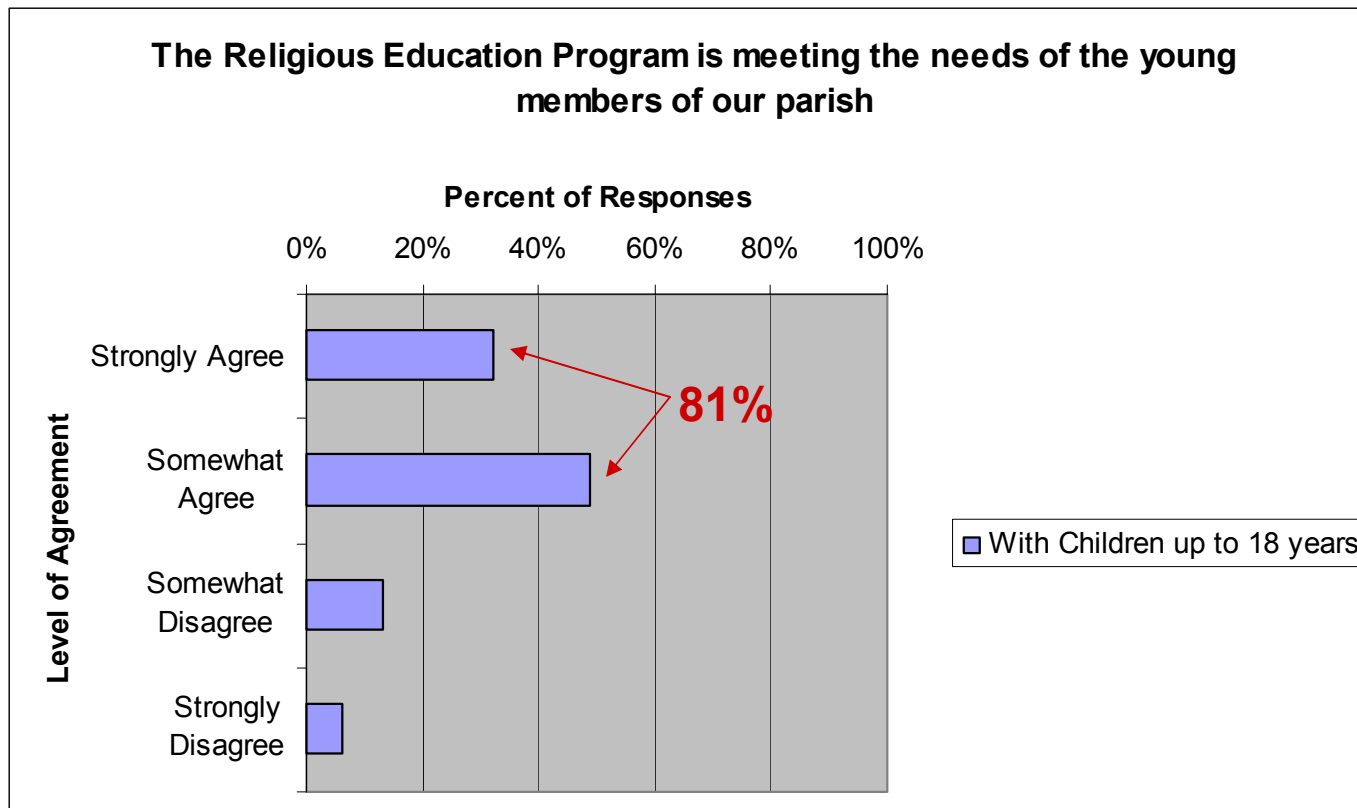


KEY POINTS

- 1) Leaving out those without personal experience or that go to our school – about 57% indicated that our catechists are a strength of the program



27) The Religious Education Program is meeting the needs of the young members of our parish.

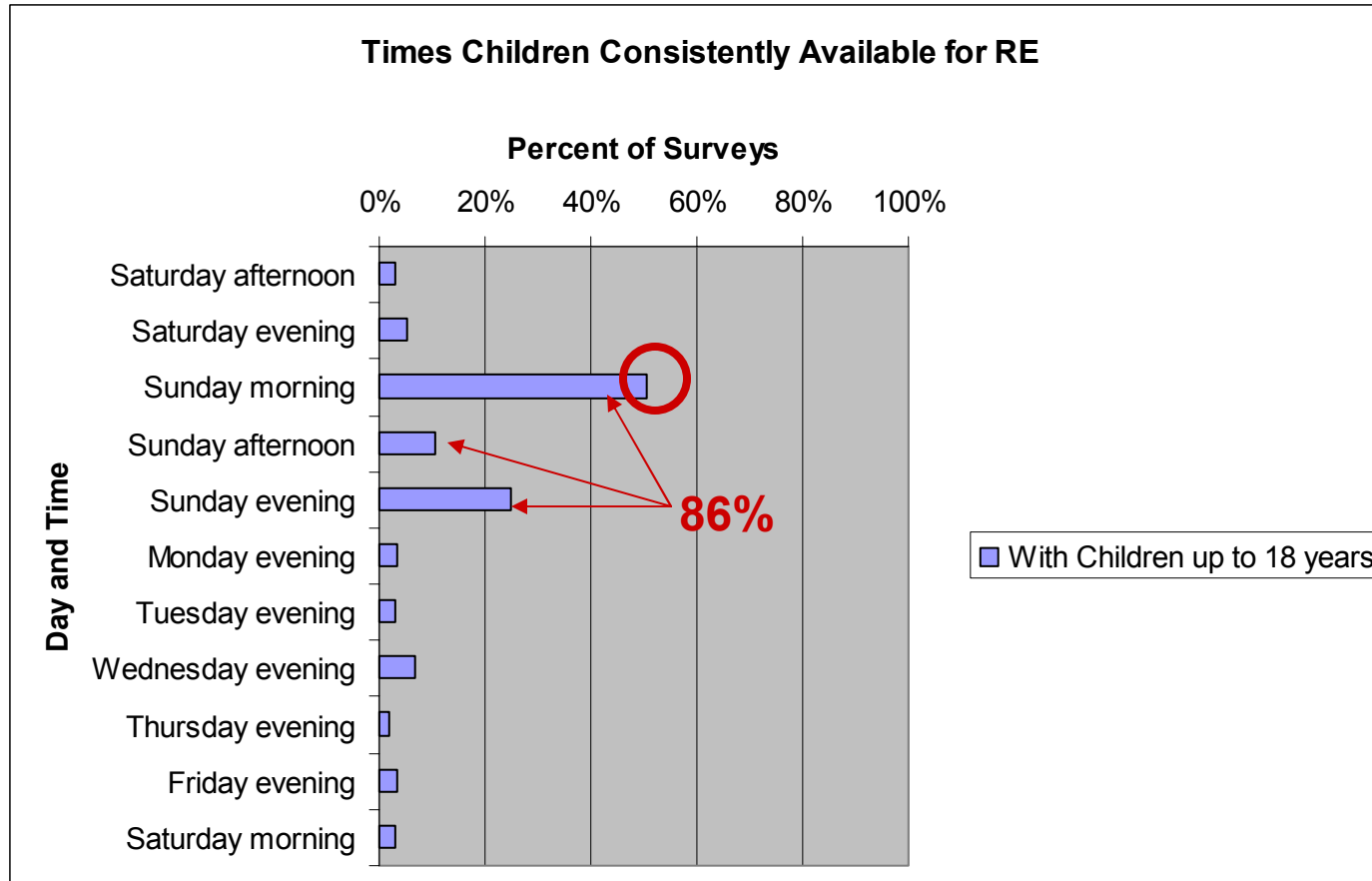


KEY POINTS

- 1) Leaving out those without children under 18 or without personal experience – 81% agree that the program is meeting the needs of the young members of our parish
- 2) 32% Strongly Agreed



28) For which times would you make your children **CONSISTENTLY** available for parish religious education? (Select all that apply)



KEY POINTS

- 1) Leaving out those without children in this age group and those taught religious ed at home – 50% said Sunday morning was the best time to make children consistently available
- 2) Another 25% preferred Sunday evening and 11% Sunday afternoon
- 3) The total preferring Sunday was 86%



Religious Education (K-8) - Summary

- Majority of respondents have their children participate in Religious Education
 - However, only 62% weekly
- 81% of parents feel that the Religious Education program meets the needs of the parish
- Sunday morning is most supported time for consistent involvement of children in Religious Education

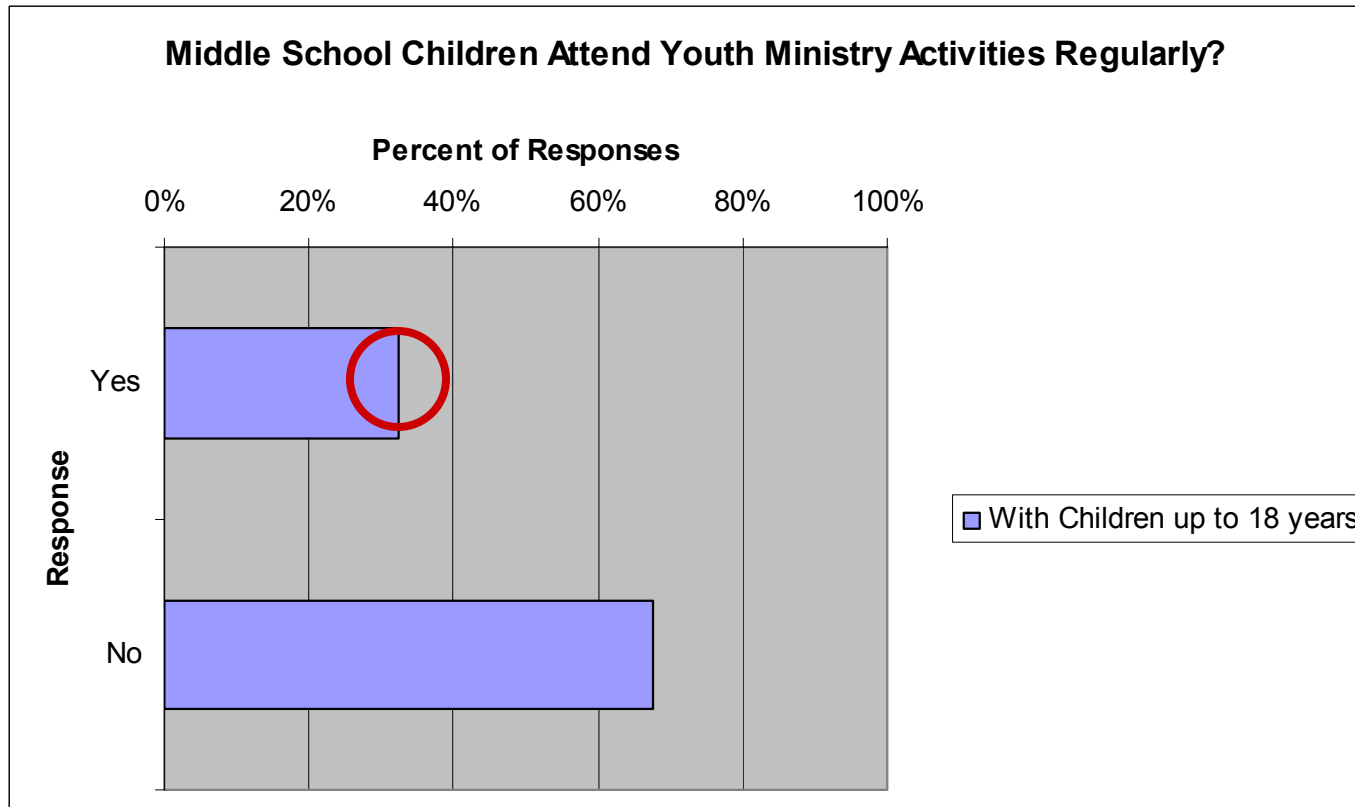

29) My middle school children attend Youth Ministry activities regularly.

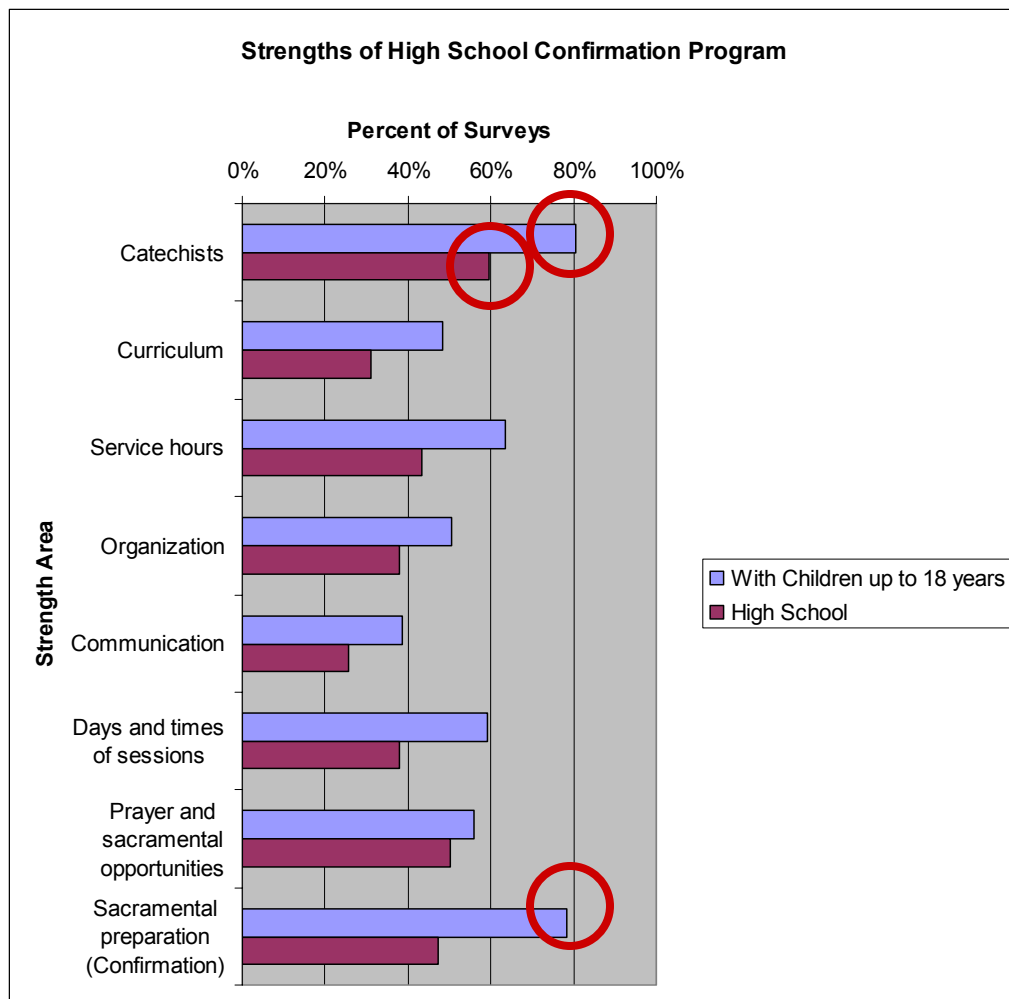


KEY POINTS

- 1) Leaving out those without children in this age group – Only 32% indicate that their middle school children attend youth ministry regularly
- 2) A few commented that the change in time made it more difficult for their children to attend
- 3) This is an improvement opportunity



30) The strengths of our High School Confirmation program are (select all that apply):

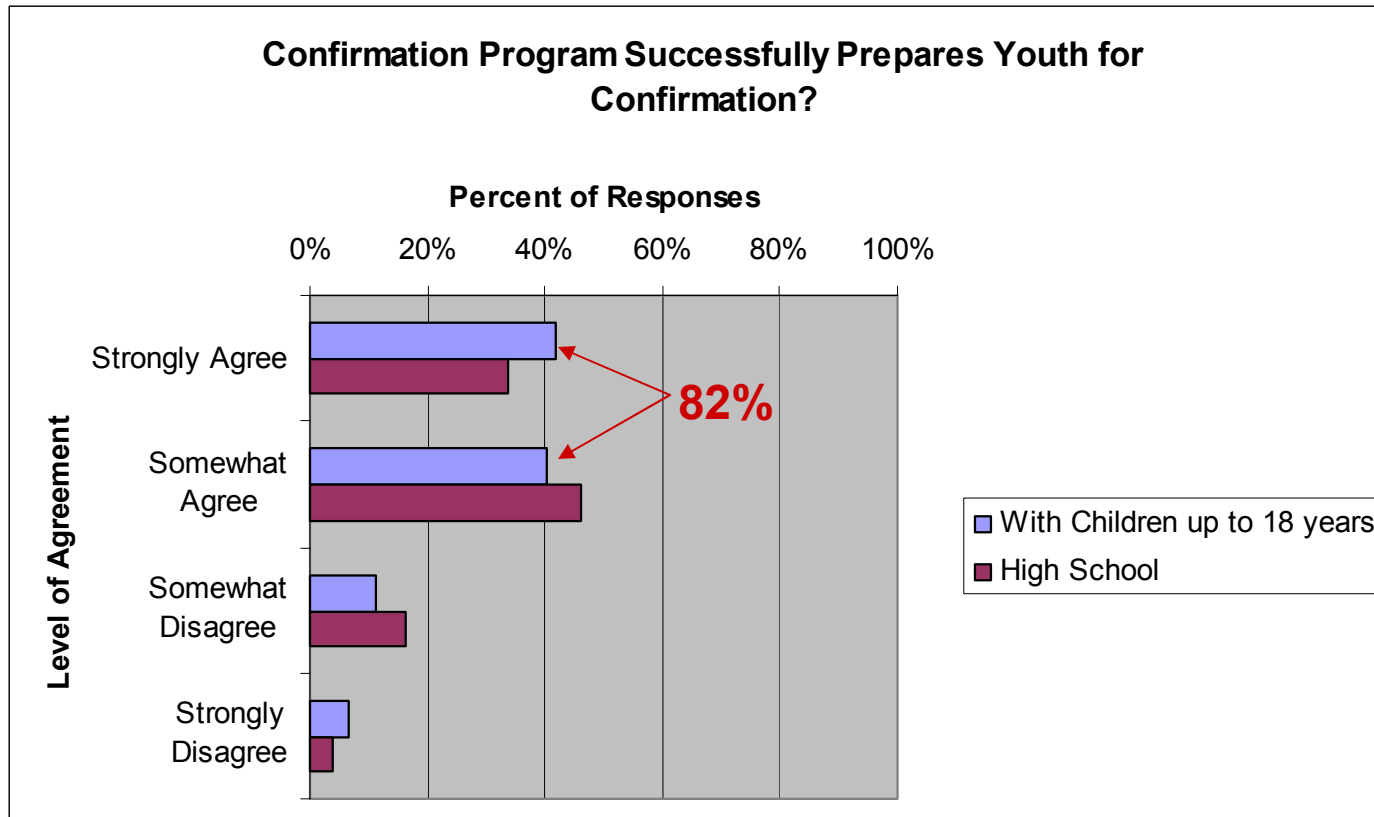


KEY POINTS

- 1) Leaving out those adults without children in this age group – 81% of adults and 59% of high school students indicate that the catechists are a strength of the program
- 2) 78% of adults indicated that the Sacramental preparation was a strength of the program



31) The Confirmation program is successful in preparing our youth for Confirmation.



KEY POINTS

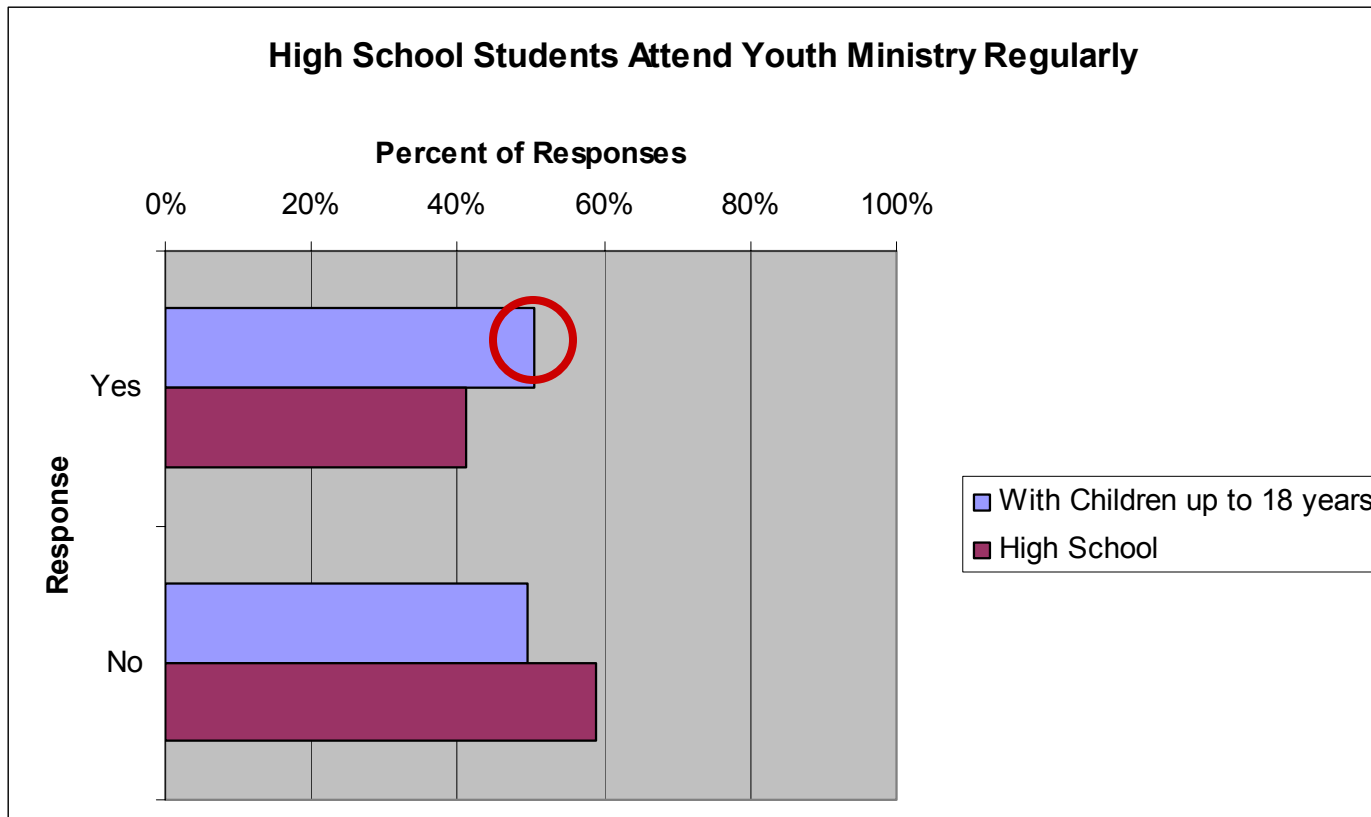
- 1) Leaving out those adults without children in this age group – 82% of adults and 80% of high school students indicate that the Confirmation Program is successful in preparing the youth for Confirmation



32) My high school children (or I) attend Youth Ministry activities regularly.

KEY POINTS

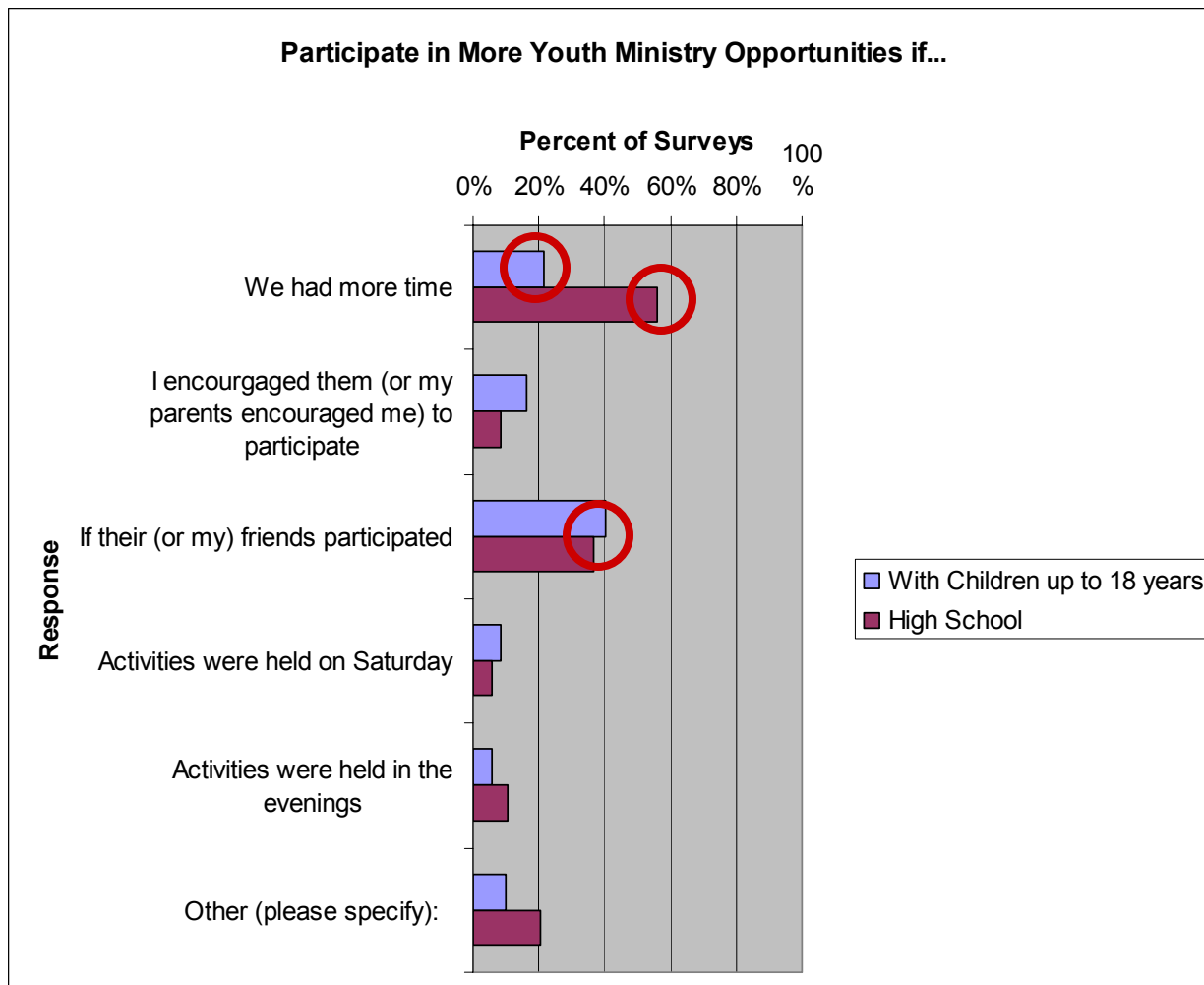
- 1) Leaving out those adults without children in this age group – 50% of adults and 41% of high school students indicate that they attend youth ministry regularly





33) My high school children would participate in more Youth Ministry opportunities (e.g. Retreats, Impact, Dead Theologians Society, Blizzard Blast, Kings Island, etc.) if (select all that apply):

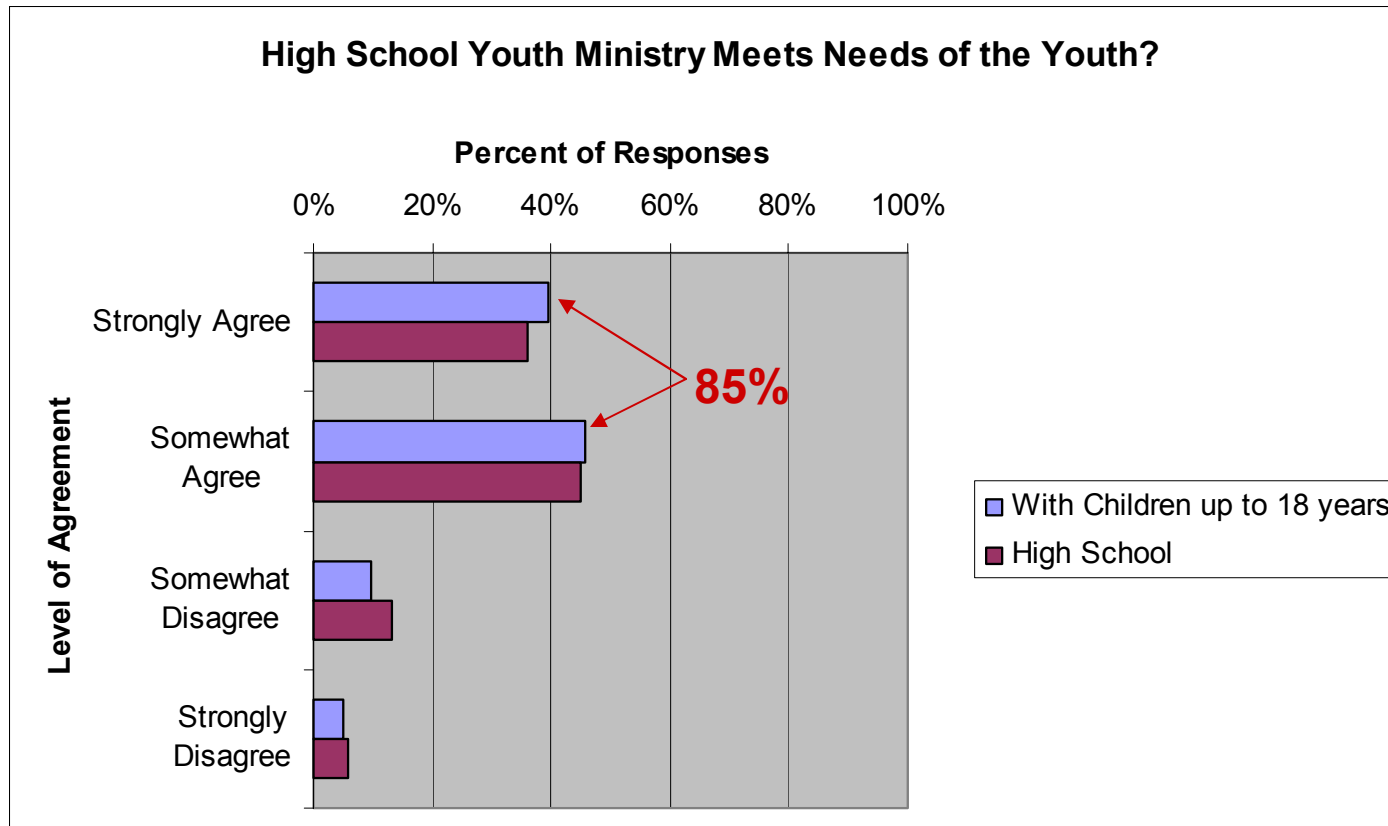
KEY POINTS



- 1) Leaving out those adults without children in this age group – 22% of adults and 56% of high school students indicate that time is the major reason they don't participate more
- 2) About 40% would participate more if their friends would
- 3) 8% of the High School children indicated they would participate more if their parents encouraged them to. 16% of the parents indicated that their children would participate more if they encouraged the children to.



34) The Youth Ministry Program is meeting the needs of the youth in our parish.



KEY POINTS

- 1) Leaving out those adults without children in this age group – 85% of adults and 81% of high school students indicate that the high school youth ministry program is meeting the needs of the youth of the parish



Youth Ministry - Summary

- Only 1/3 of middle school children attend youth ministry activities regularly
- Catechists and Confirmation preparation were the highest strength areas of the youth ministry
 - 81% of adults and 59% of high school students indicated that the catechists were a strength of the program
- 82% of adults and 80% of High School students agree that the Confirmation program is successful in preparing our youth for Confirmation



Youth Ministry - Summary

- Only about ½ of High School students attend youth ministry activities regularly (students themselves indicate 40%)
- Time is the biggest factor why the high school students do not participate more in youth ministry activities
 - About 40% indicated that they would participate more if their friends would participate
- Four out of five high school students indicate that the Youth Ministry program is meeting their needs

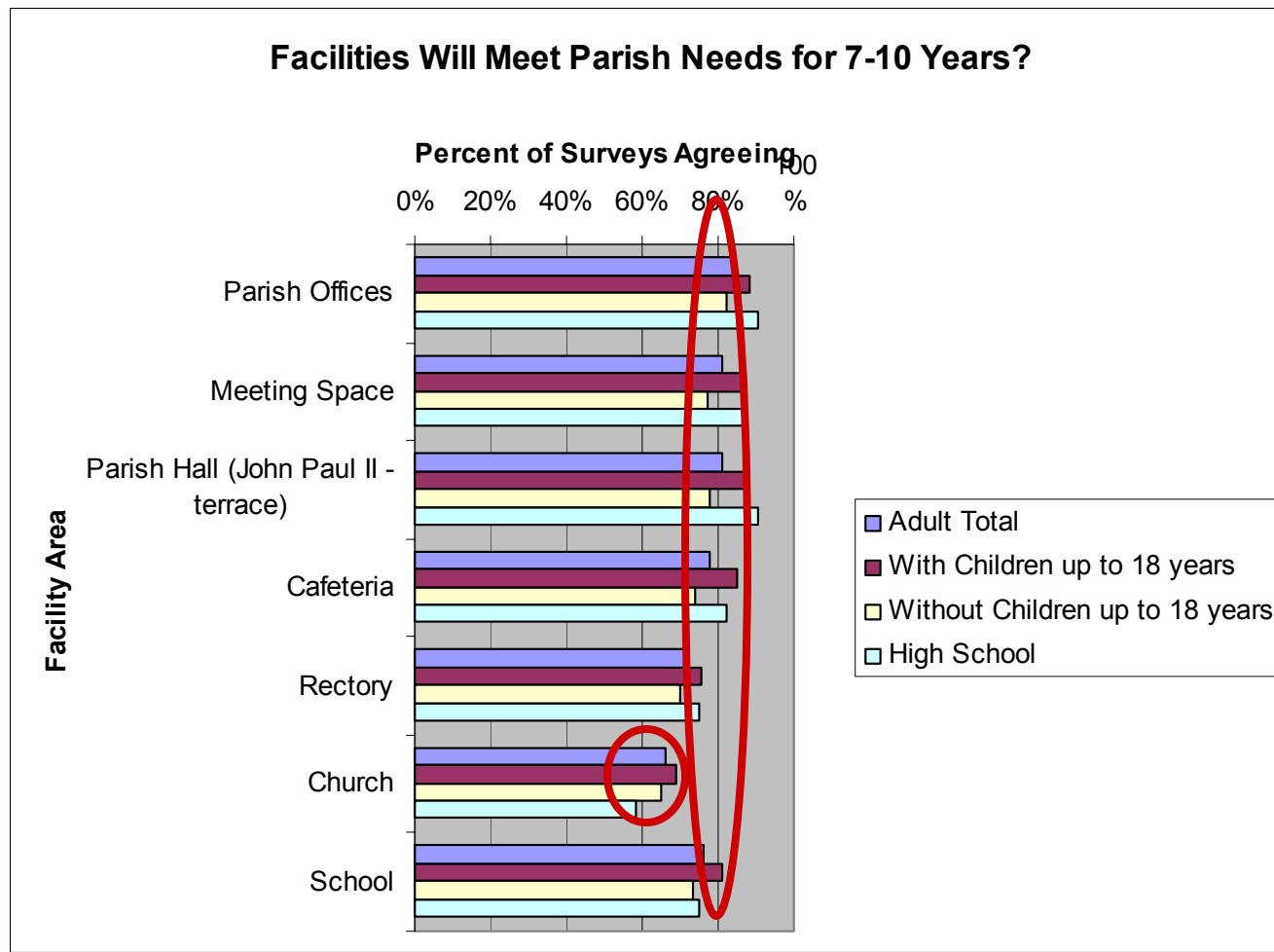

Facilities Questions



35) Our parish facilities will adequately serve the needs of our parish for the next 7-10 years.

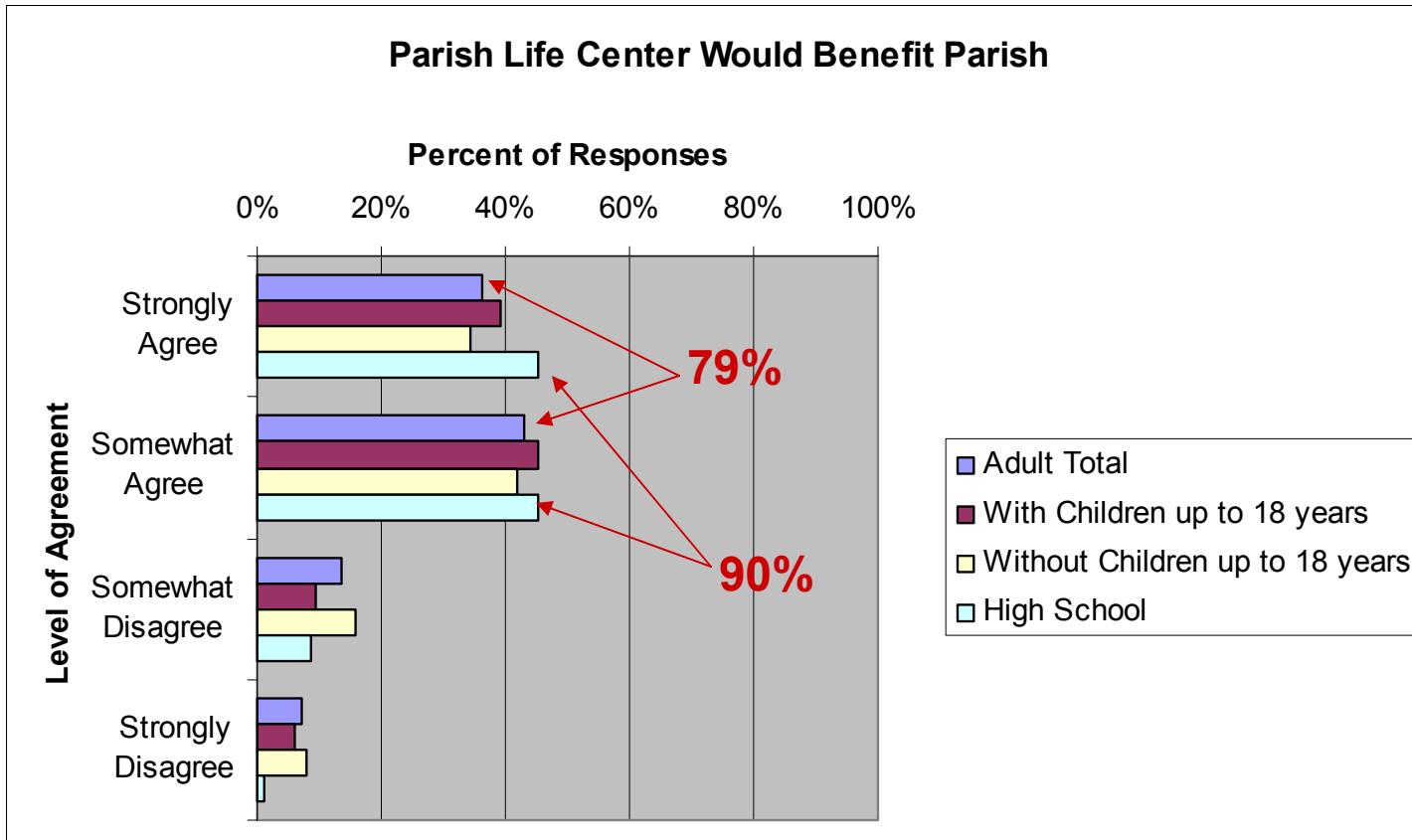


KEY POINTS

- 1) About 80% agree that most of the facilities will meet parish needs for another 7-10 years. The church was the lowest indication with only 66% of the adults and 58% of the High School students agreeing that it will meet the needs for another 7-10 years.
- 2) The school and rectory were the next least likely to meet our parish needs in the future.



36) A Parish Life Center (gym, etc.) would benefit the vitality of parish and school events at St. Joan of Arc.

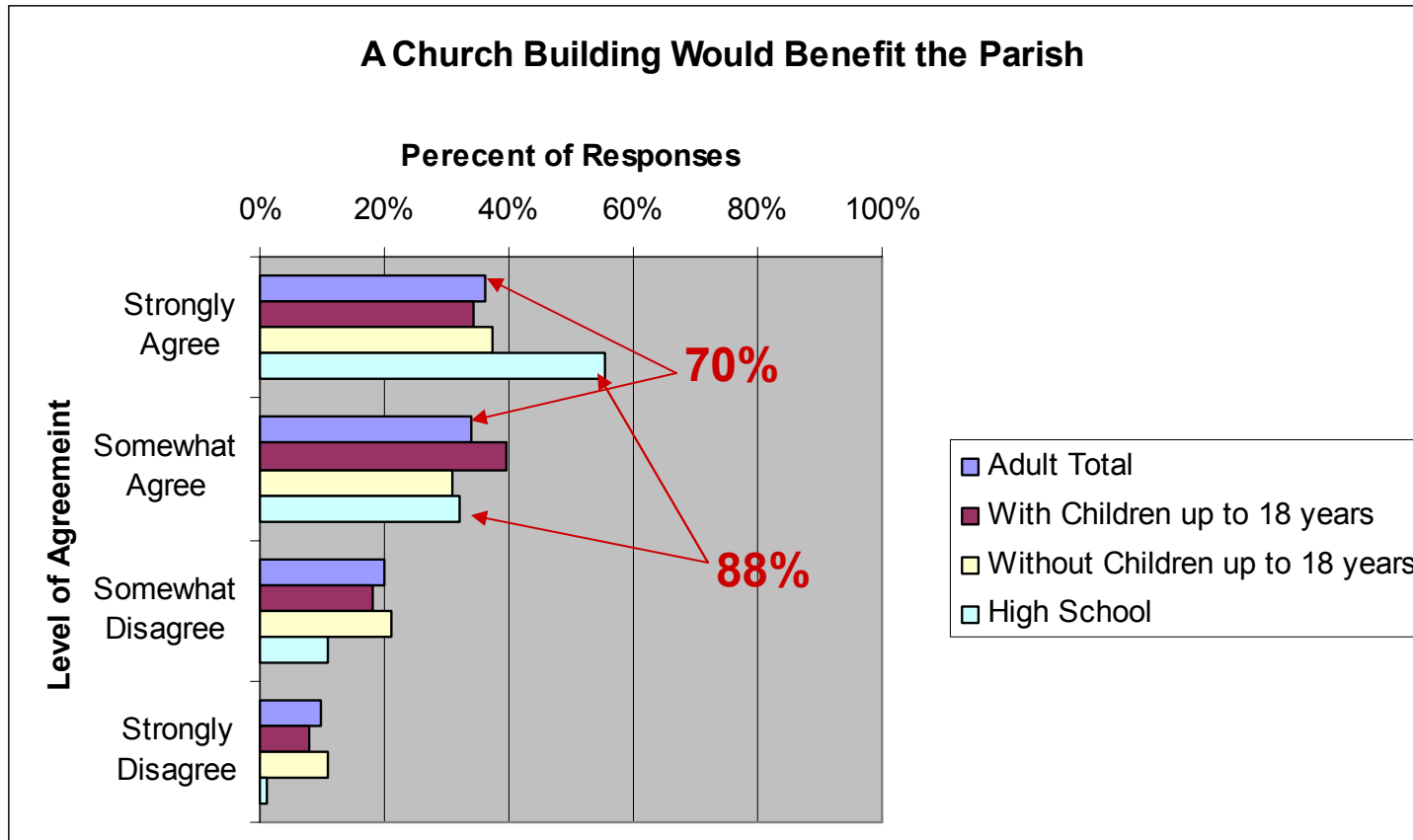


KEY POINTS

- 1) 79% of adults agree that a Parish Life Center (with gym) would benefit the parish
- 2) For the High School students it was higher at 90%



37) A church building would benefit the vitality of parish and school events at St. Joan of Arc.



KEY POINTS

- 1) 70% of adults agree that a church building would benefit the parish
- 2) For the High School students it was higher at 88%



Facilities - Summary

- About 80% agree that the facilities will meet our needs for another 7-10 years
 - Only 66% indicated so for the church (lowest response)
- About 80% of adults and 90% of high school students surveyed agreed that a Parish Life Center (gym) would benefit the parish
- The church numbers were similar but only 70% of the adults agreed

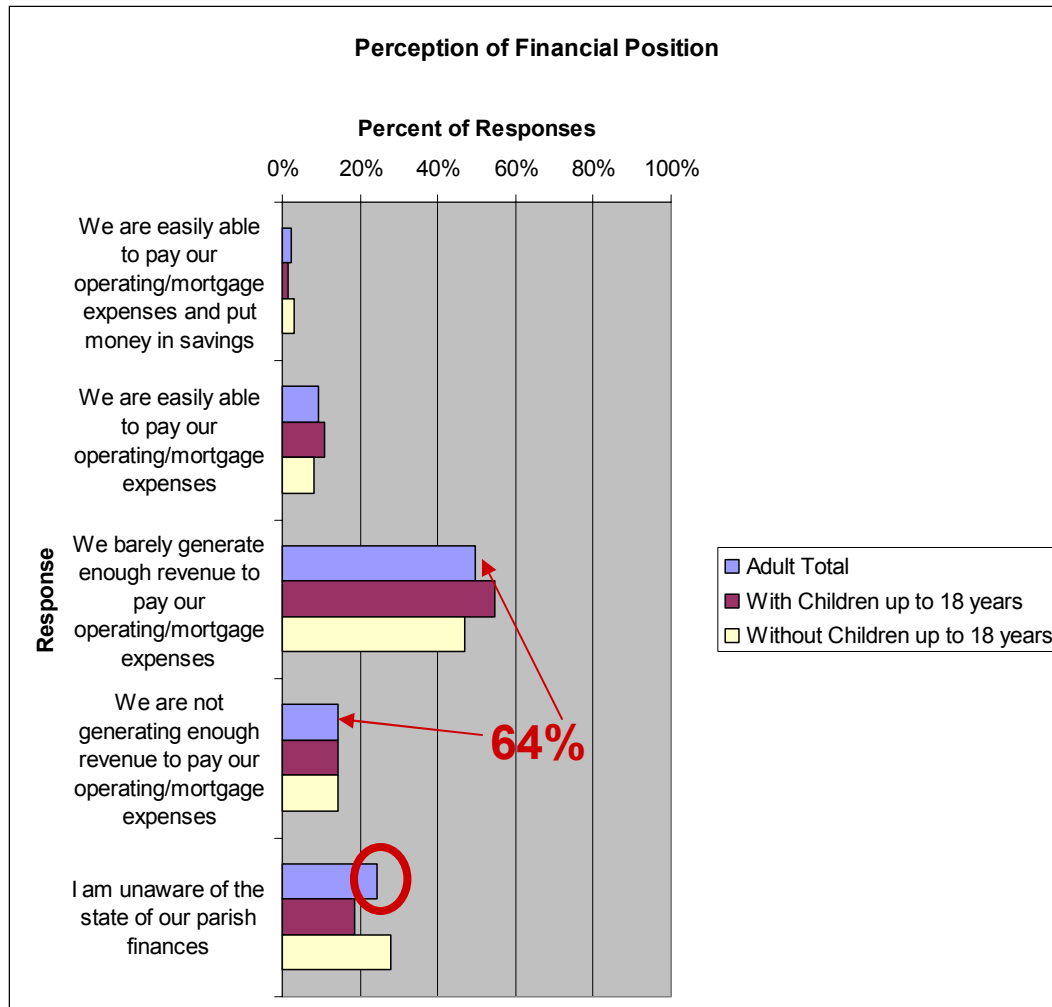

38) What is your perception of St. Joan of Arc's current financial position?



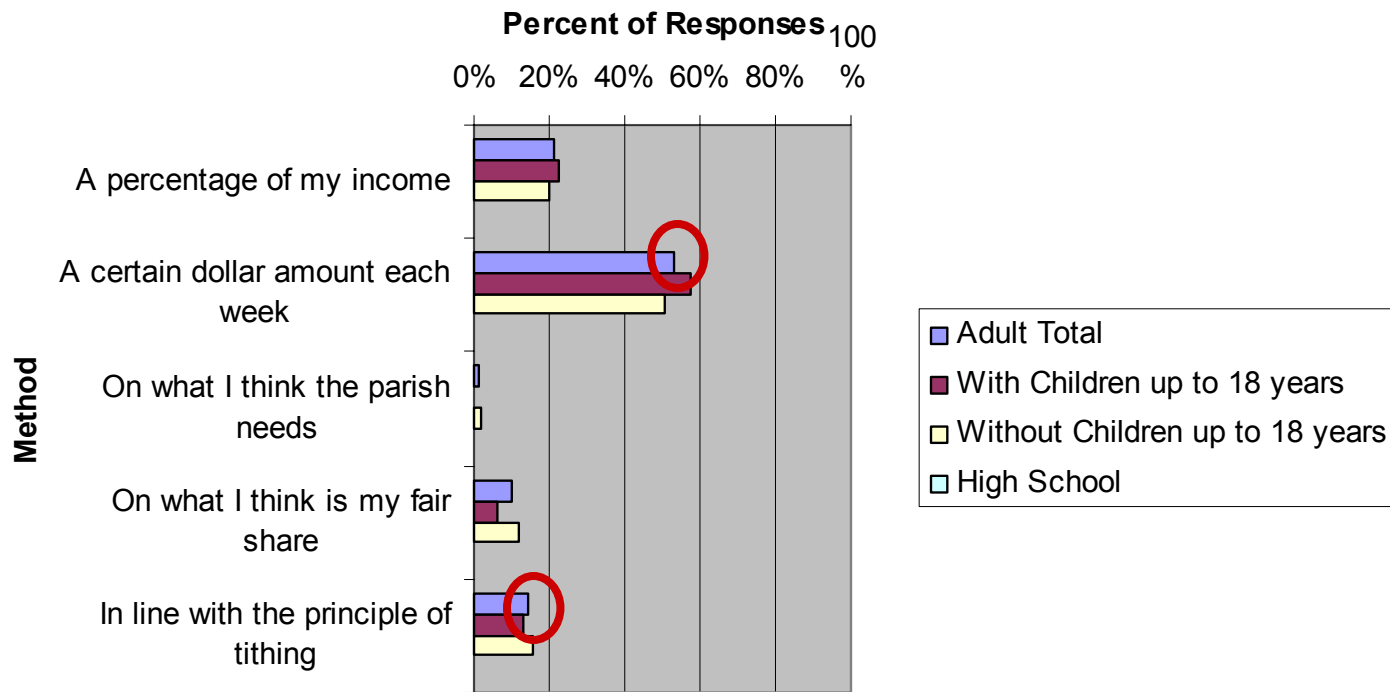
KEY POINTS

- 1) We barely covered our operating and mortgage expenses for 2009 (\$5.5K in the black). Therefore the 3rd and 4th answers would be close to being correct. That means that 64% of the adults were close.
- 2) 24% are unaware of the state of our finances and another 7% did not answer this question.
- 3) This is an area for improvement.



39) How do you determine the amount you contribute in the offertory collection?

How Offertory Contribution is Determined

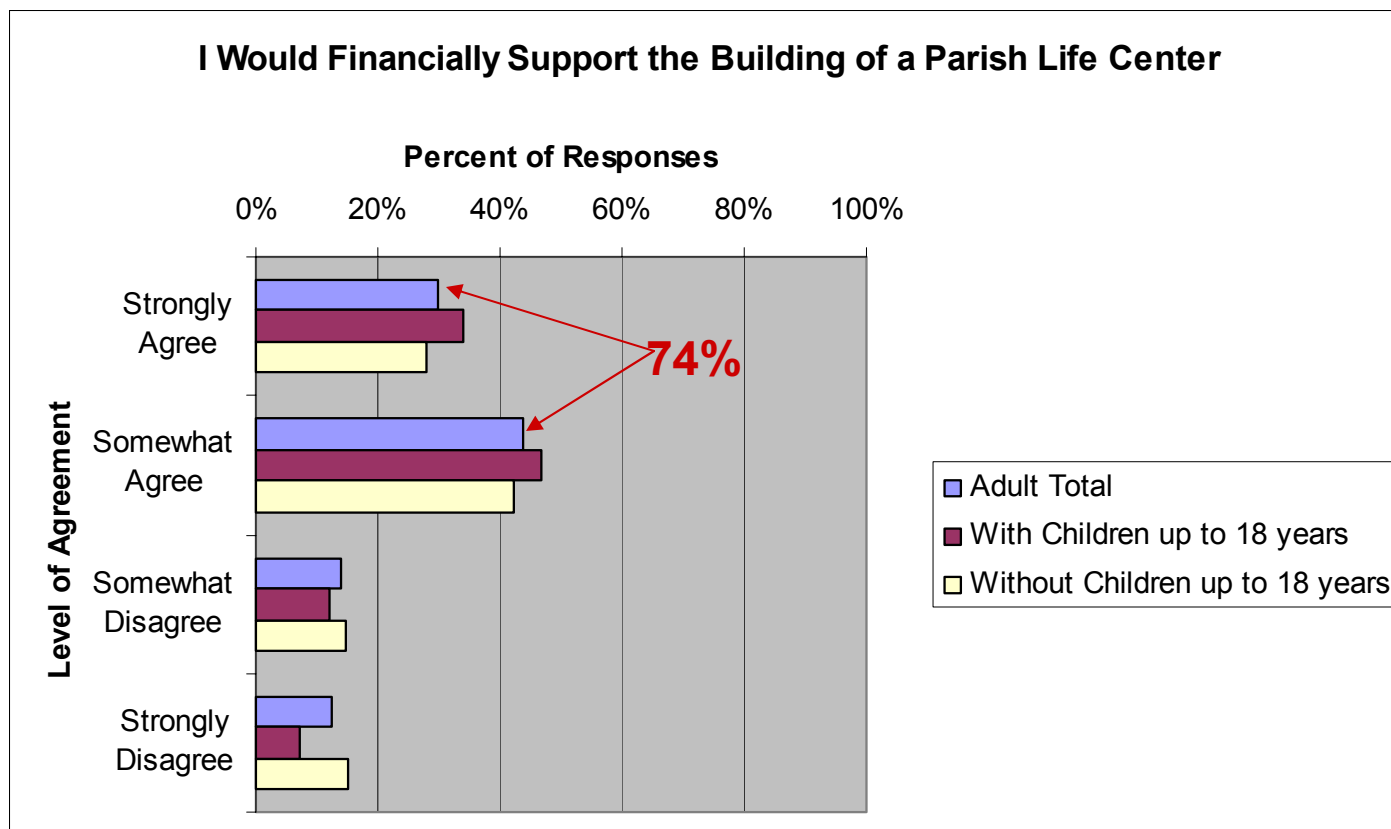


KEY POINTS

- 1) 15% contribute in line with the principle of tithing
- 2) 50% contribute a certain dollar amount each week.
- 3) The possibility exists that some people's dollar amount or even percentage of income responses could be based on the principle of tithing.



40) I would financially support the building of a Parish Life Center (gymnasium, etc.) once our mortgage has been paid.



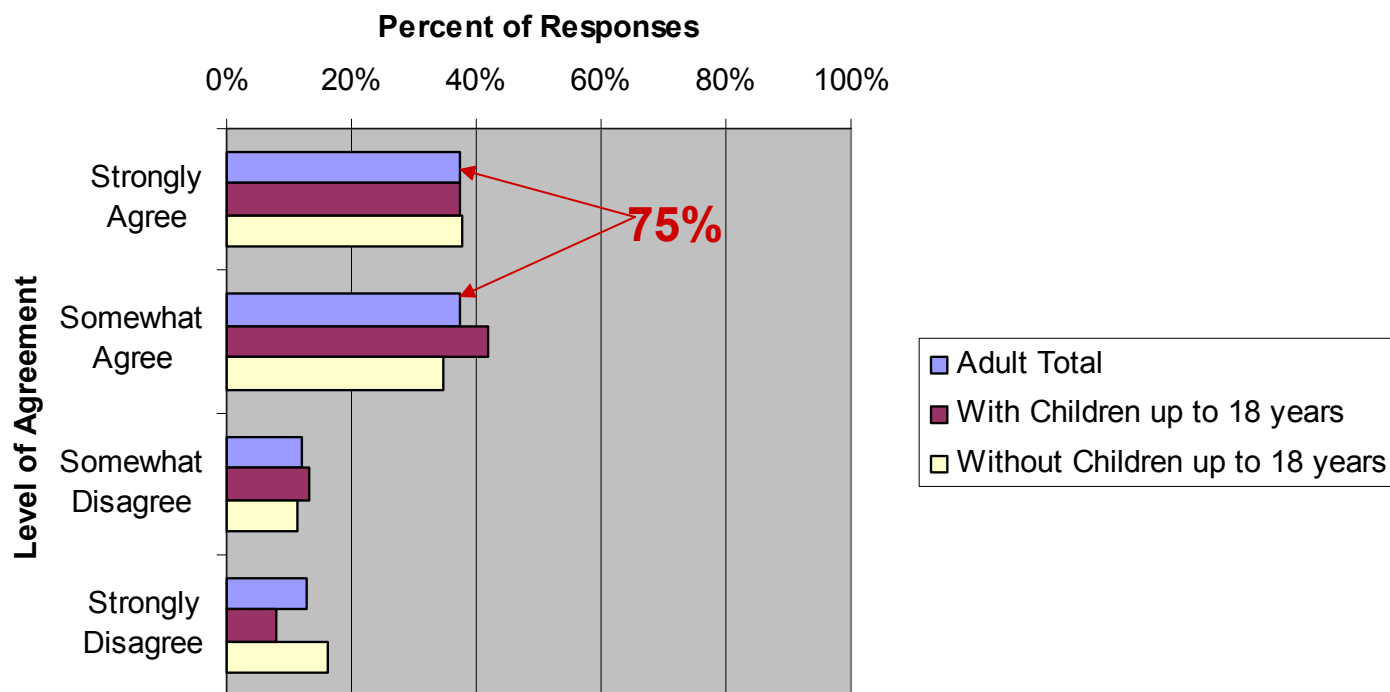
KEY POINTS

- 1) 74% would financially support the building of a Parish Life Center. This is 5% below those that indicated that it would benefit the parish.
- 2) 30% Strongly Agreed



41) I would financially support the building of a new church building once our mortgage has been paid.

I Would Financially Support the Building of a New Church Building

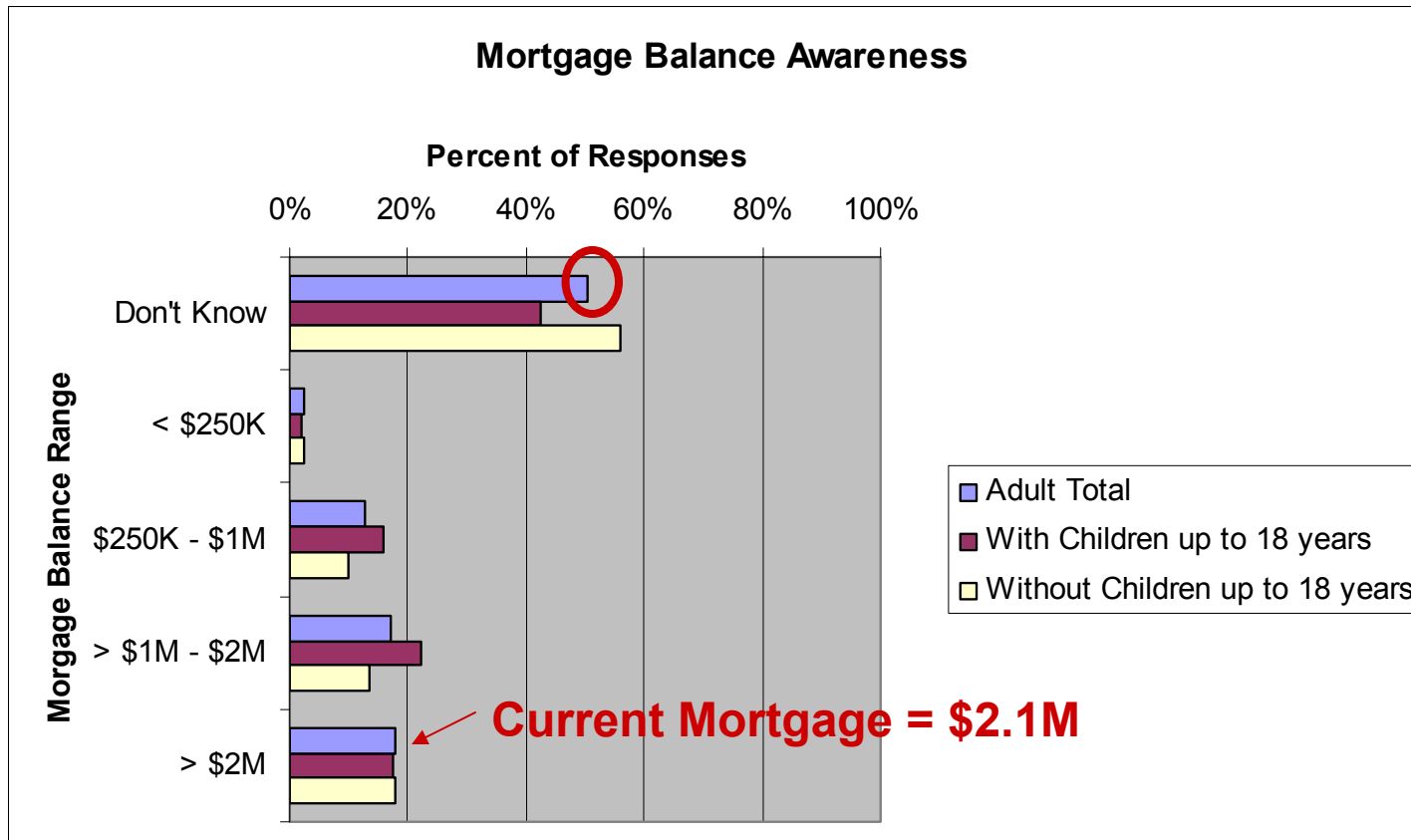


KEY POINTS

- 1) 75% indicated that they would financially support the building of a new church building. This is 1% higher than the Parish Life Center so the numbers are basically the same.
- 2) This number is 5% HIGHER than the 70% that indicated it would benefit the parish.



42) How much do you think our current mortgage balance is?

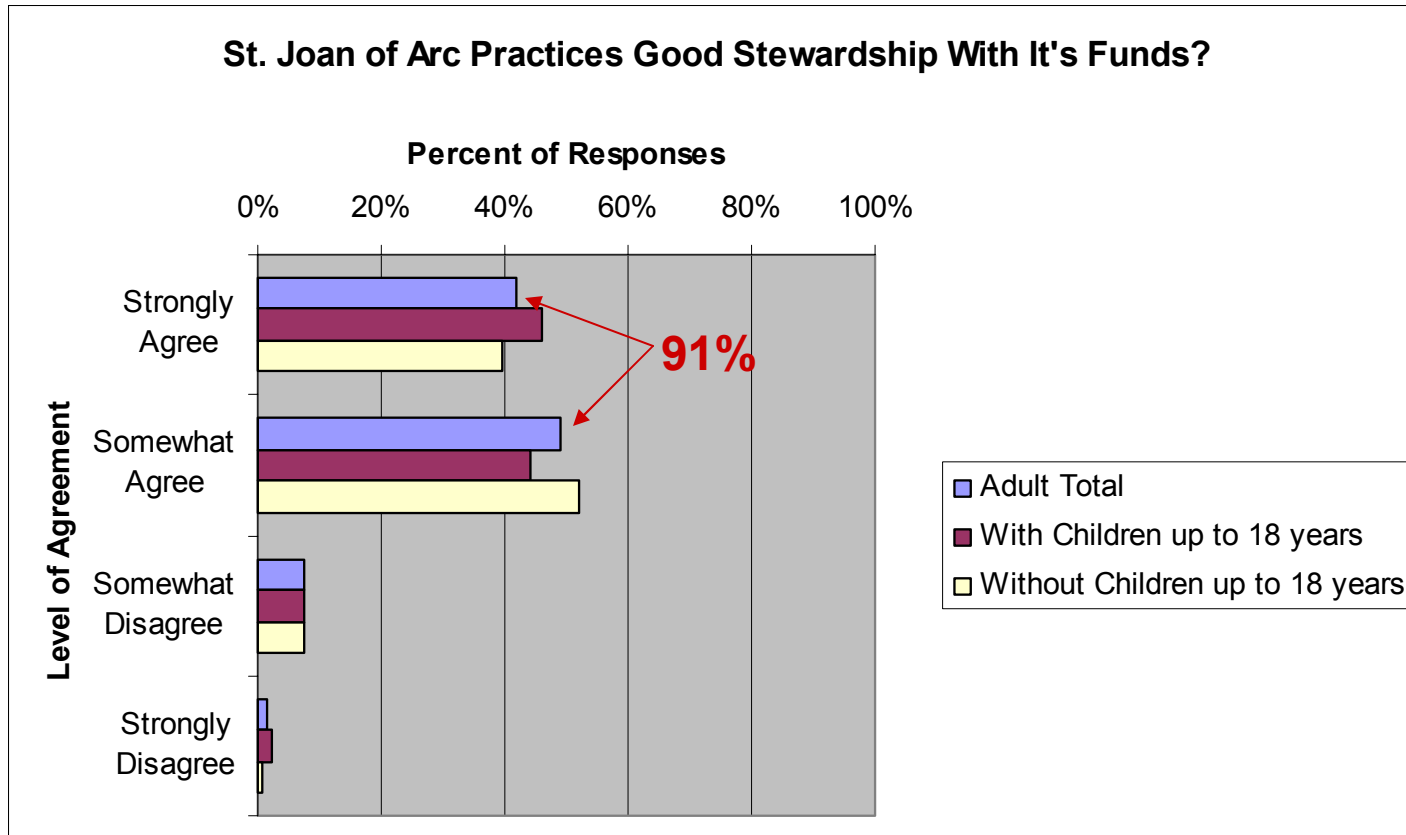


KEY POINTS

- 1) 50% of the respondents indicated that they did not know what our current mortgage balance is.
- 2) Another 20% or so were off on their estimates.
- 3) We have located a graph in the gathering space showing our current mortgage value and how it is declining. It will be updated monthly.



43) St. Joan of Arc practices good stewardship with the funds it receives.



KEY POINTS

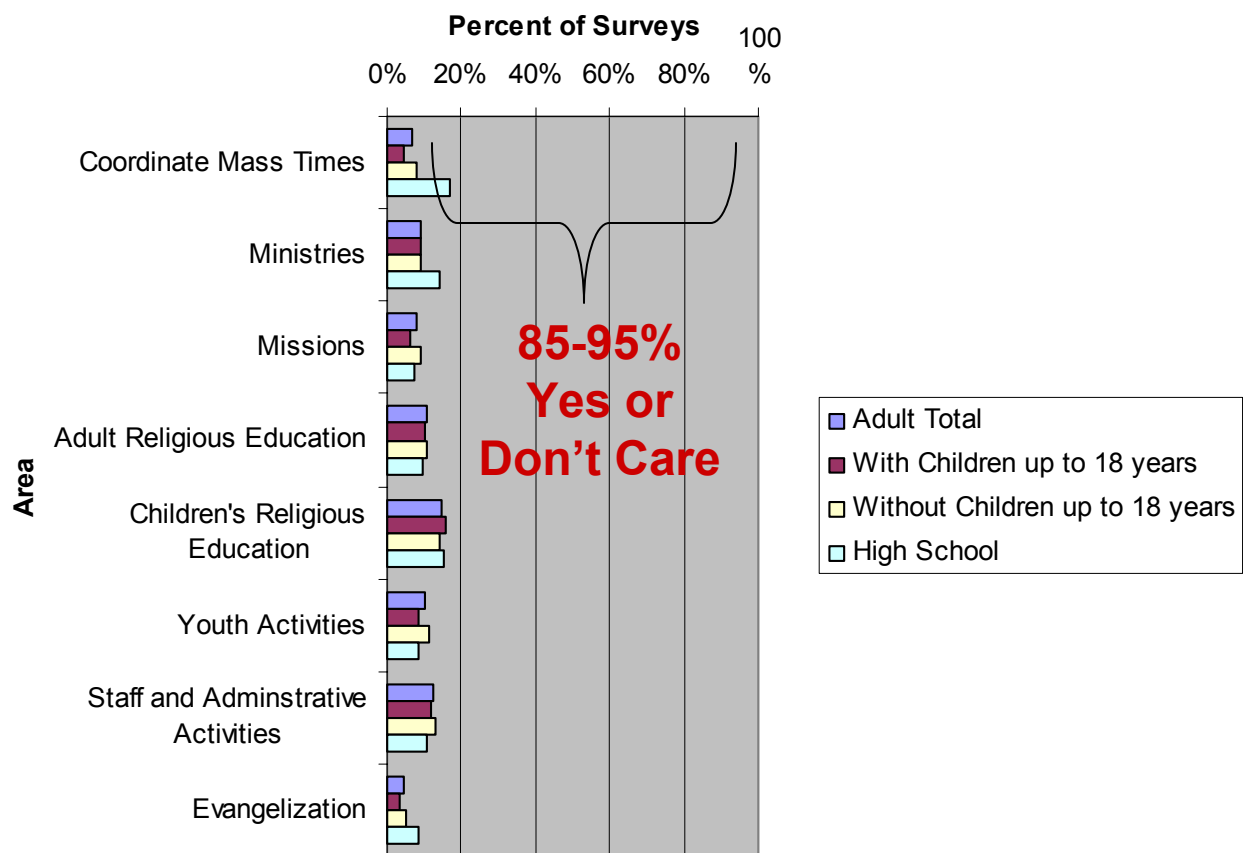
- 1) 91% of the adults agree that St. Joan of Arc practices good stewardship with it's funds.

KEY POINTS

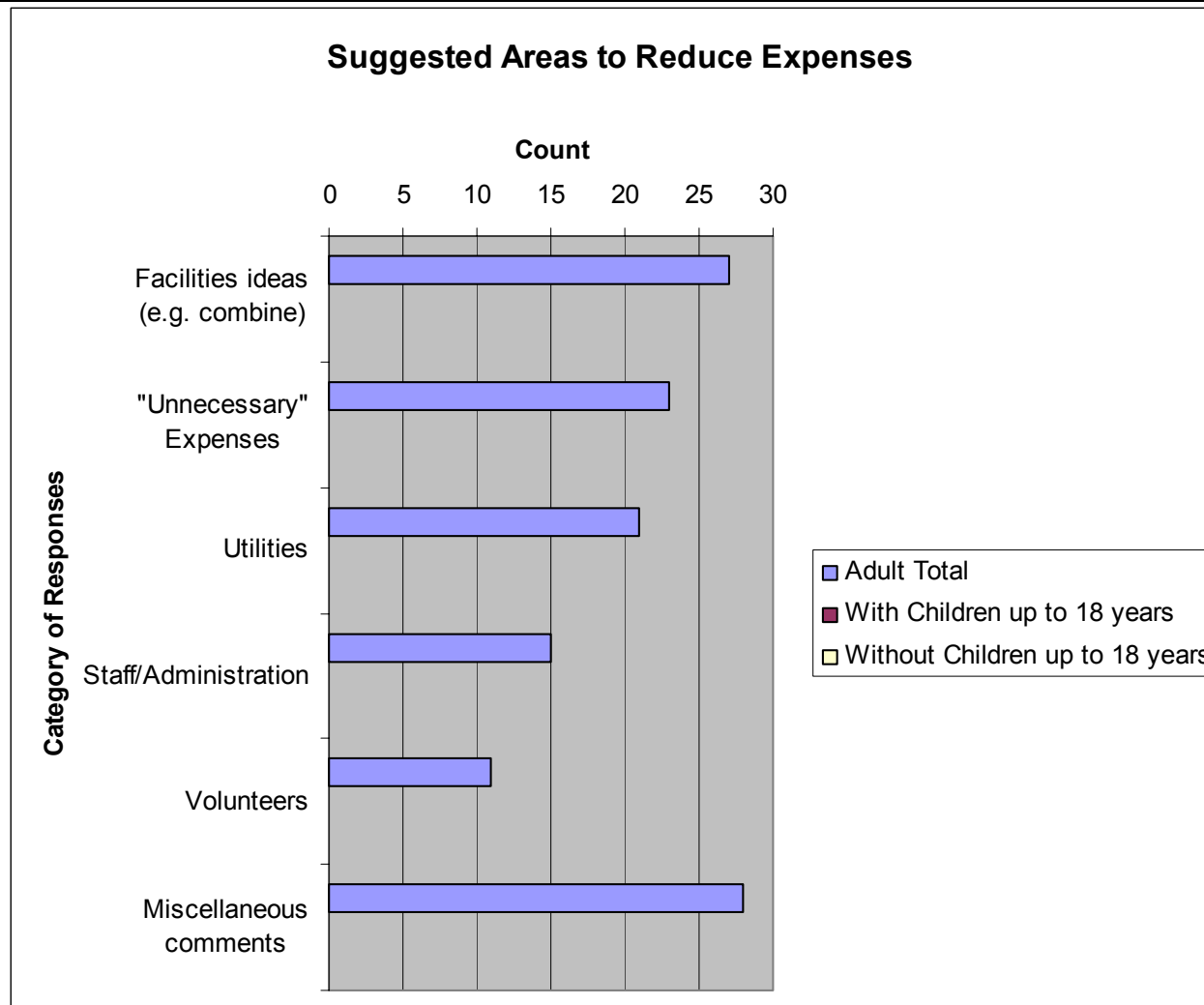
Should St. Joan of Arc and St. Patrick Work Together in These Areas - "NO" Responses



- 1) This graph shows the "NO" responses so about 85% to 95% indicated that we should work with St. Patrick in the above areas or did not care.
- 2) The top "No" vote-getters were Children's Religious Education, Staff and Administrative, Adult Religious Education and Youth Activities.
- 3) There were a few written comments about combining the churches – pro and con. There are no plans to pursue or do this. This question was looking at how the parish felt about working together where it could save both churches money or where we could be more effective.



45) Do you have any suggestions for how the parish can further reduce its expenses?



KEY POINTS

- 1) Again keep in mind that the longest bars only represent about 3% of the surveys



Stewardship - Summary

- 2/3 are close to understanding our financial situation
 - One-fourth have no awareness of our status
- Half of parishioners give a certain dollar amount each week and one fourth give a percentage of income
 - One in seven tithe
- 75% of parishioners agree that they could help support building a Parish Life Center or a new church building once our mortgage is paid
- Half of parishioners indicated that they didn't know what our mortgage balance is and another 20% were a ways off on their estimate
- Nine out of ten parishioners feel SJA practices good stewardship with the funds it receives
- About 85% to 95% indicated that we should work with St. Patrick in the areas noted in the survey

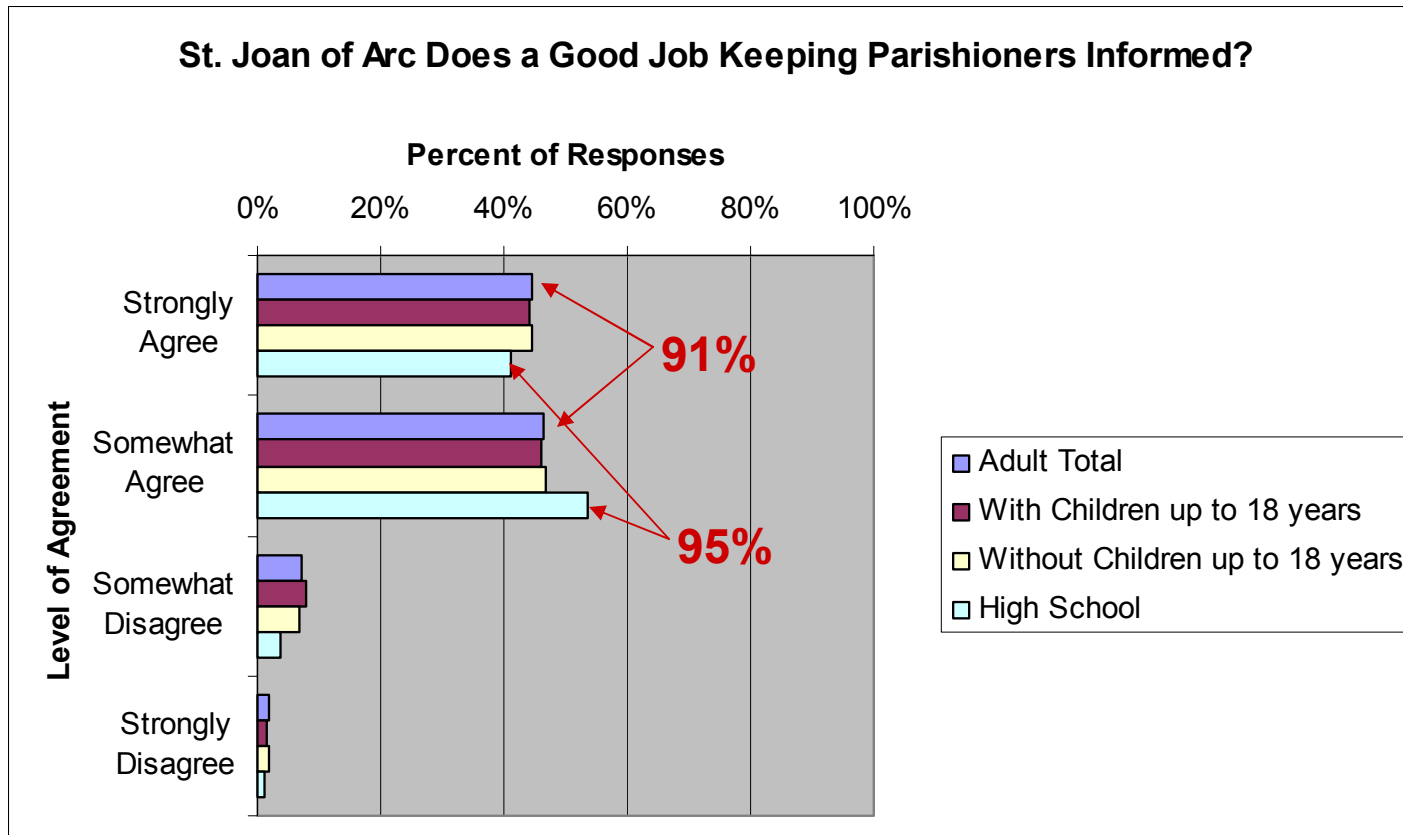

Communications Questions



46) St. Joan of Arc does a good job keeping the parishioners informed.



KEY POINTS

- 1) 91% agree that we do a good job keeping parishioners informed. If there are areas where you think we can do better, please let us know.
- 2) 95% of the High School students indicated that we do a good job keeping the parishioners informed

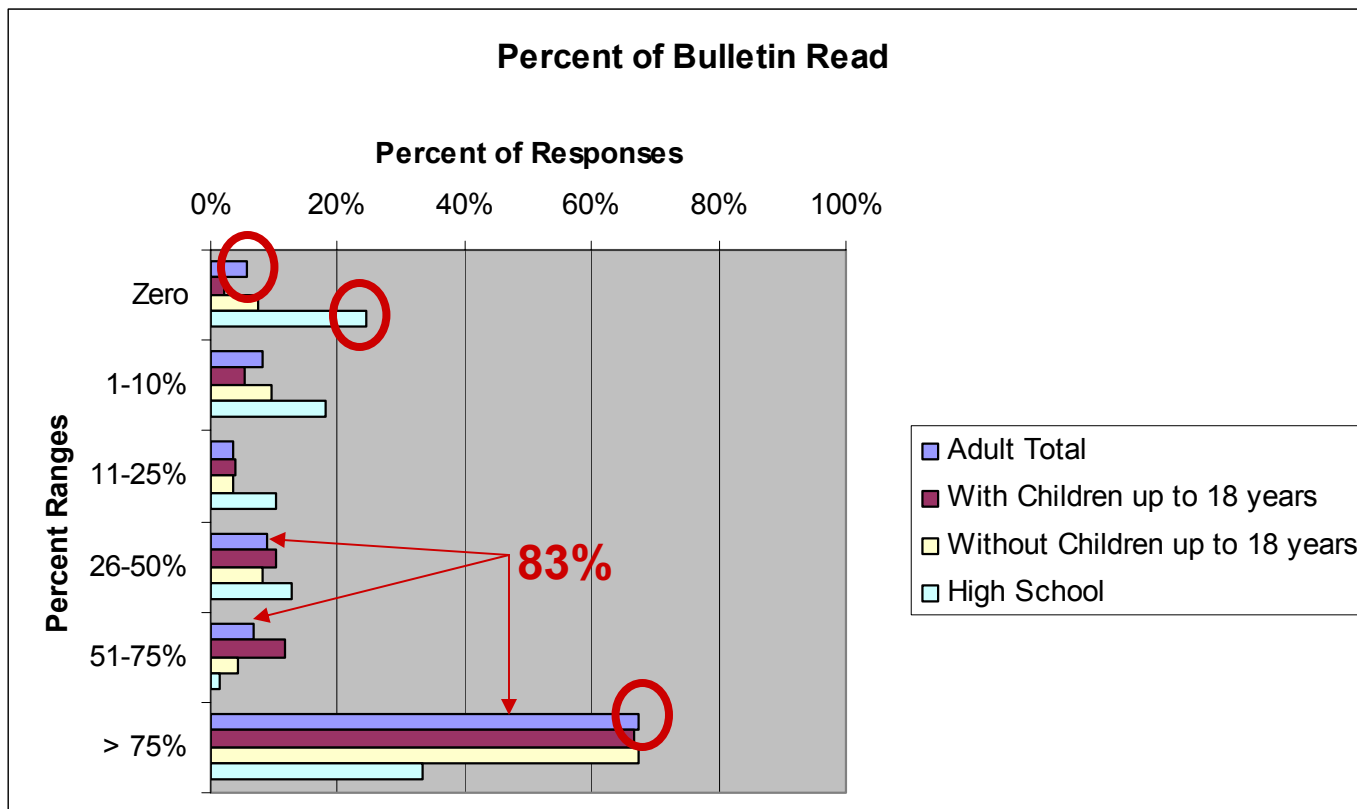


47) What percent of the content of each of these publications/programs would you say you regularly read or listen to?

Bulletin

KEY POINTS

- 1) The Bulletin is our most widely utilized communication tool. 67% of adults read over 75% of the Bulletin and 83% read at least 25% of it.
- 2) Only 6% of adults do not read the Bulletin.
- 3) 24% of the High School students do not read the Bulletin and only 33% read over 75% of it.
- 4) We probably need a better way to communicate with the High School students.

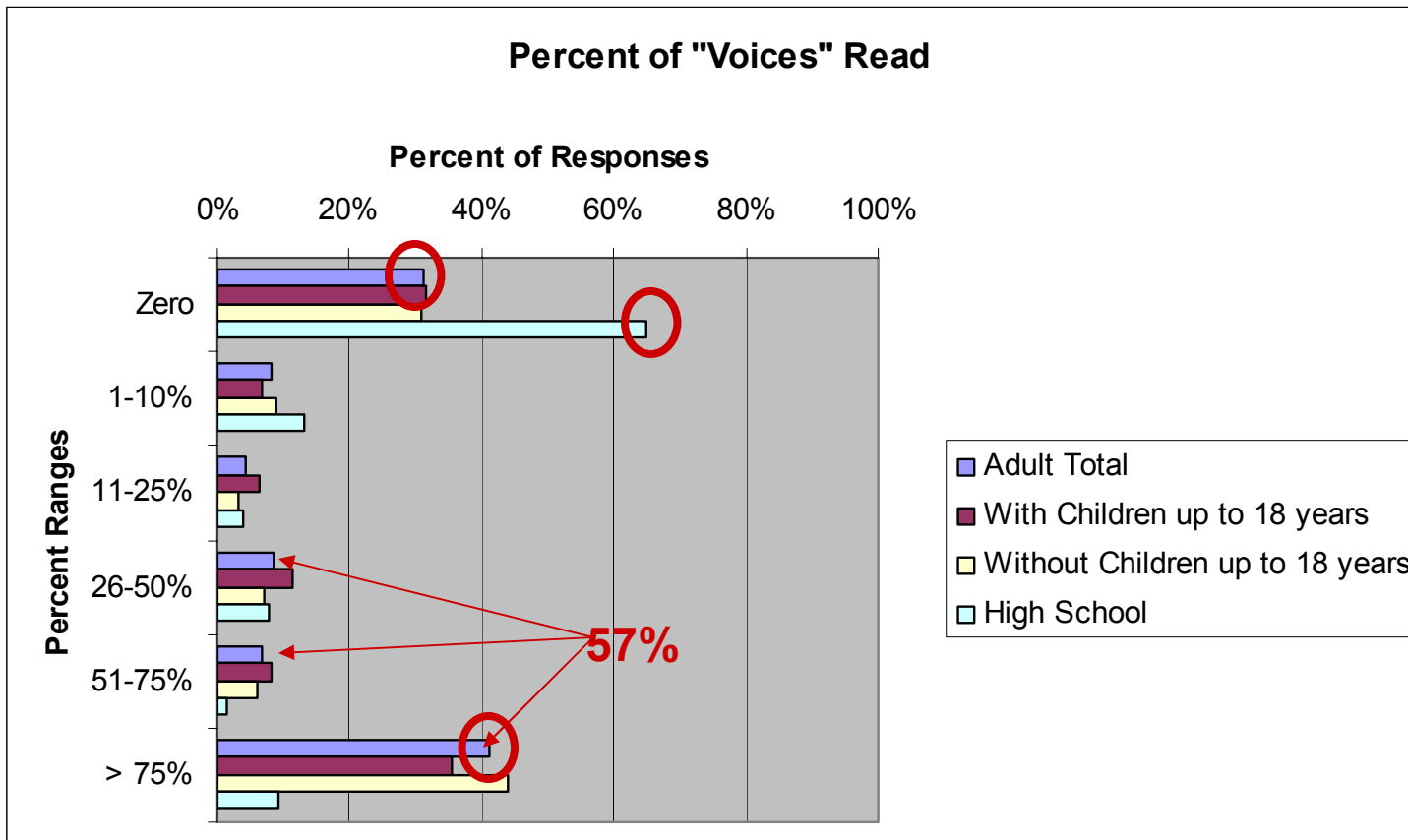




47) What percent of the content of each of these publications/programs would you say you regularly read or listen to?

KEY POINTS

Voices



- 1) The Voices Newsletter is the next most utilized communication means. 41% of adults read over 75% of it and 57% at least 25%.
- 2) However, 31% of adults do not read Voices at all!
- 3) Only 9% of High School student read 75% of Voices and 65% don't read any of it.

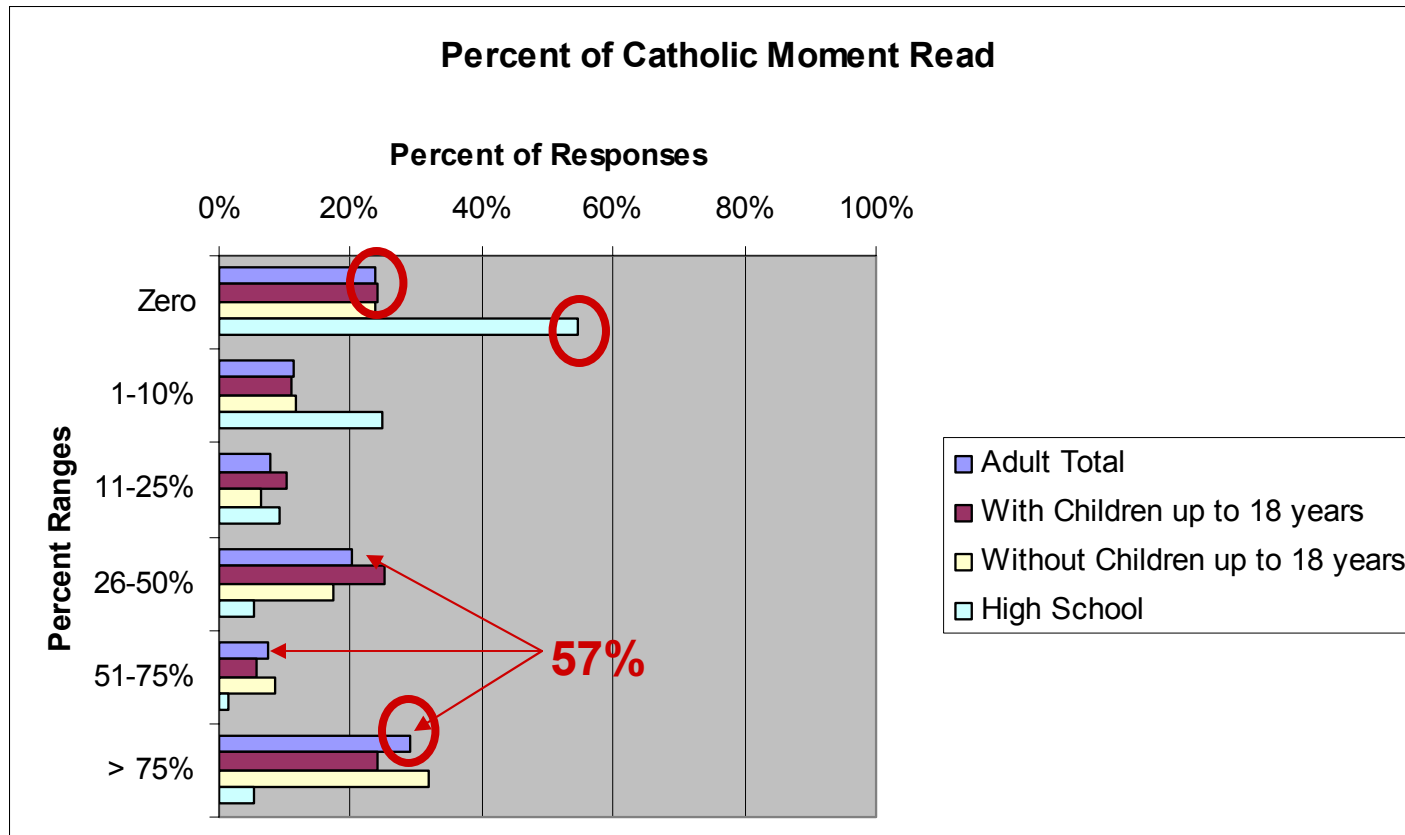


47) What percent of the content of each of these publications/programs would you say you regularly read or listen to?

KEY POINTS

- 1) 29% of adults read at least 75% of the Catholic Moment. 57% read at least 25% of it (which is the same as Voices).
- 2) 24% of adults do not read any of the Catholic Moment.
- 3) Only 5% of the High School read more than 75% of the Catholic Moment. 55% do not read it at all.

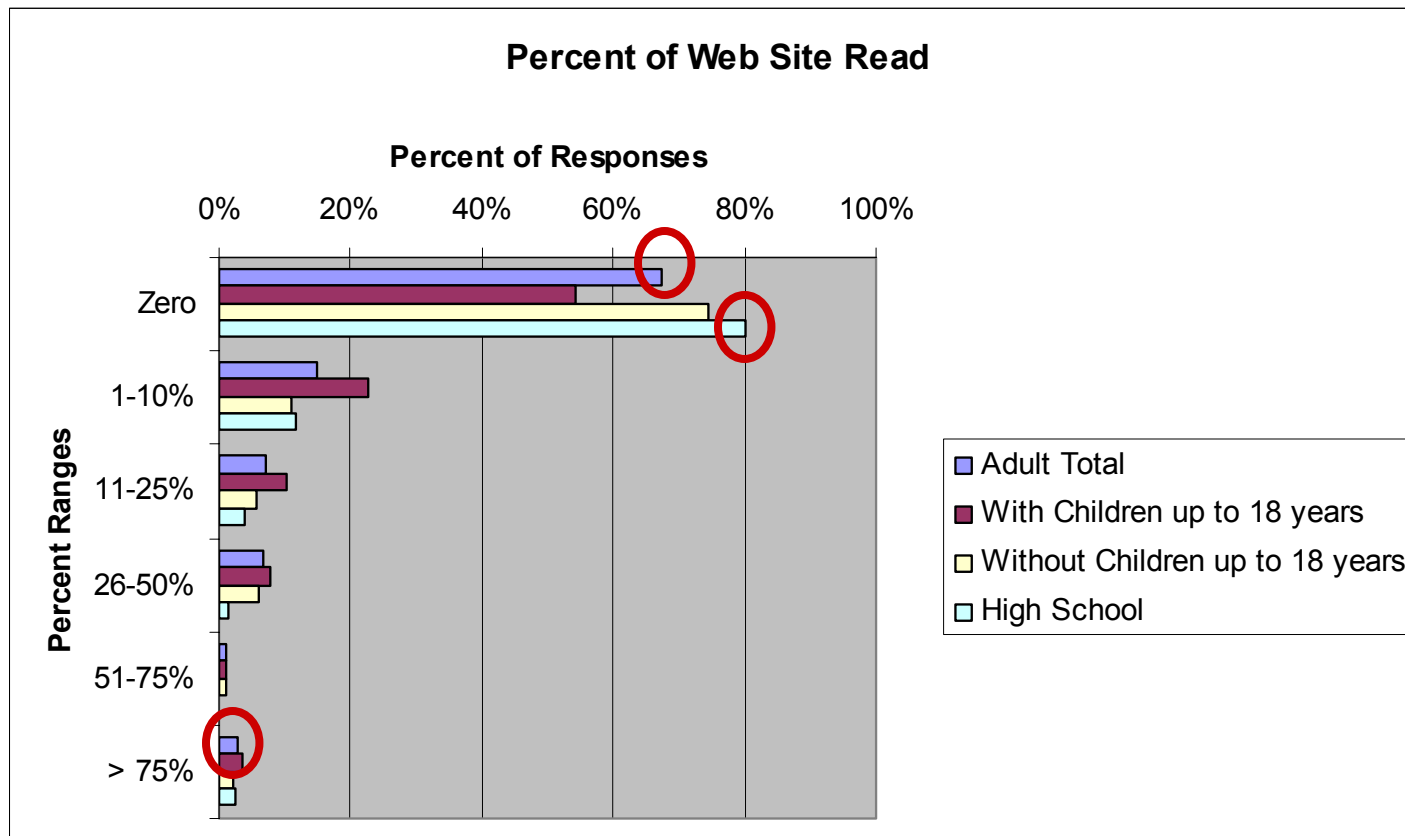


47) What percent of the content of each of these publications/programs would you say you regularly read or listen to?

KEY POINTS

- 1) 67% of adults have never used the web site – meaning only 33% have ever used it - and only 3% have read 75% of it.
- 2) The new updated website has lots of content. A few survey respondents indicated they either forgot about the website or didn't know about it. Some also indicated that they did not have a computer.
- 3) 3% of the High School students indicated that they read over 75% of the web site which is the same rate as the adult figure. On the other hand, 80% have not looked at it at all.

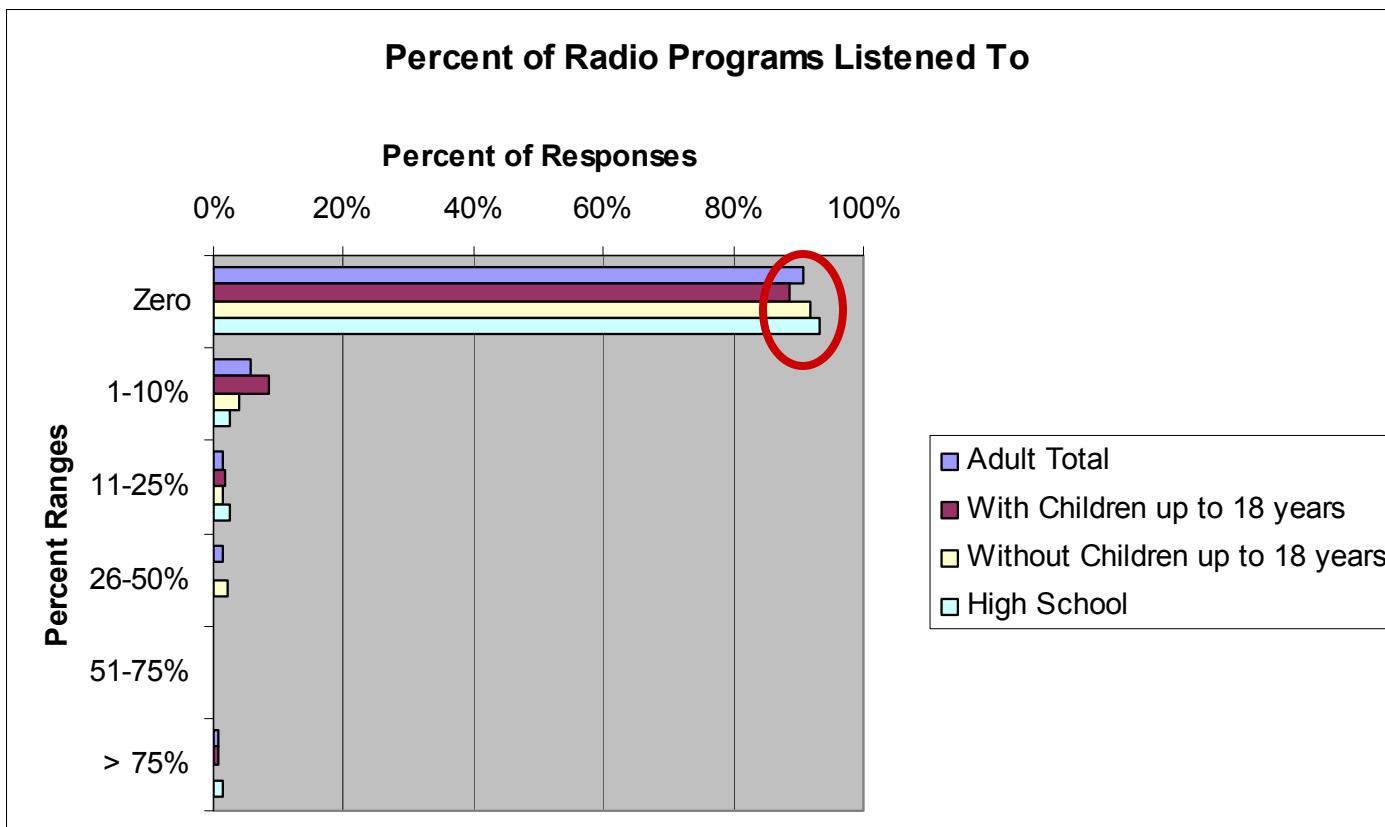

KEY POINTS

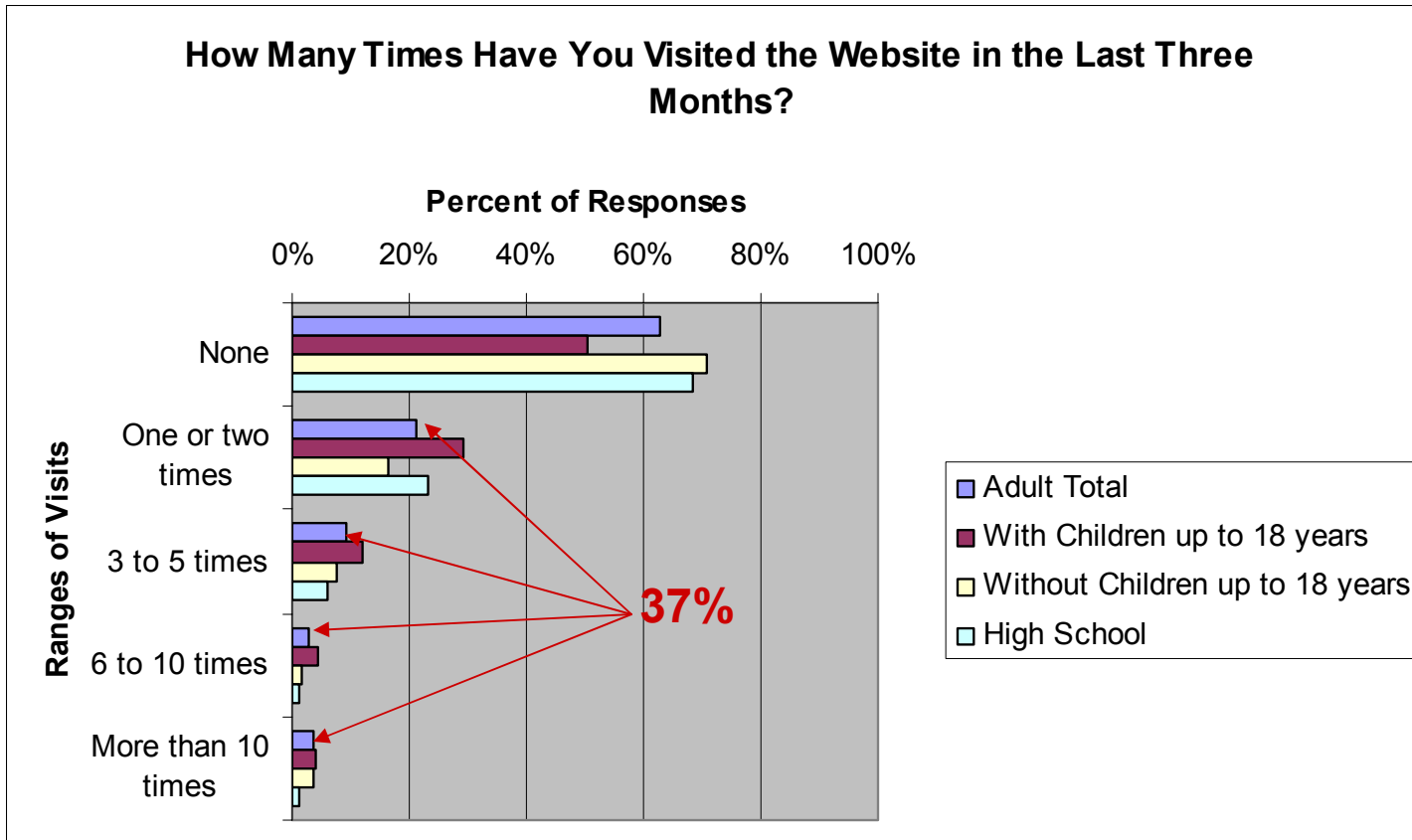
Radio Program



- 1) The radio program is the least used by our respondents. In some cases it occurs during their Mass time (9 AM Mass).
- 2) 91% have NOT listened to the radio program.
- 3) The radio program is an evangelization tool. The programs are also available on the web site or on CD for your listening convenience.



48) In the last three months, how many times have you visited our new and updated website?



KEY POINTS

- 1) In the last 3 months, 37% have used the website with most of those a few times.
- 2) For the same time period, 32% of the High School students have used the website. (There is some error in the responses as only 20% included some percentage of usage in the prior question.)



Communications - Summary

- Nine out of ten parishioners agree that SJA does a good job of keeping them informed
- Three-fourths of parishioners read at least half of the bulletin each week
- One-half of parishioners read at least half of each Voices issue
- One-third of parishioners read at least half of each Catholic Moment issue
- The web site is used by only one-third of parishioners
- The weekly radio program is heard by only one in ten parishioners

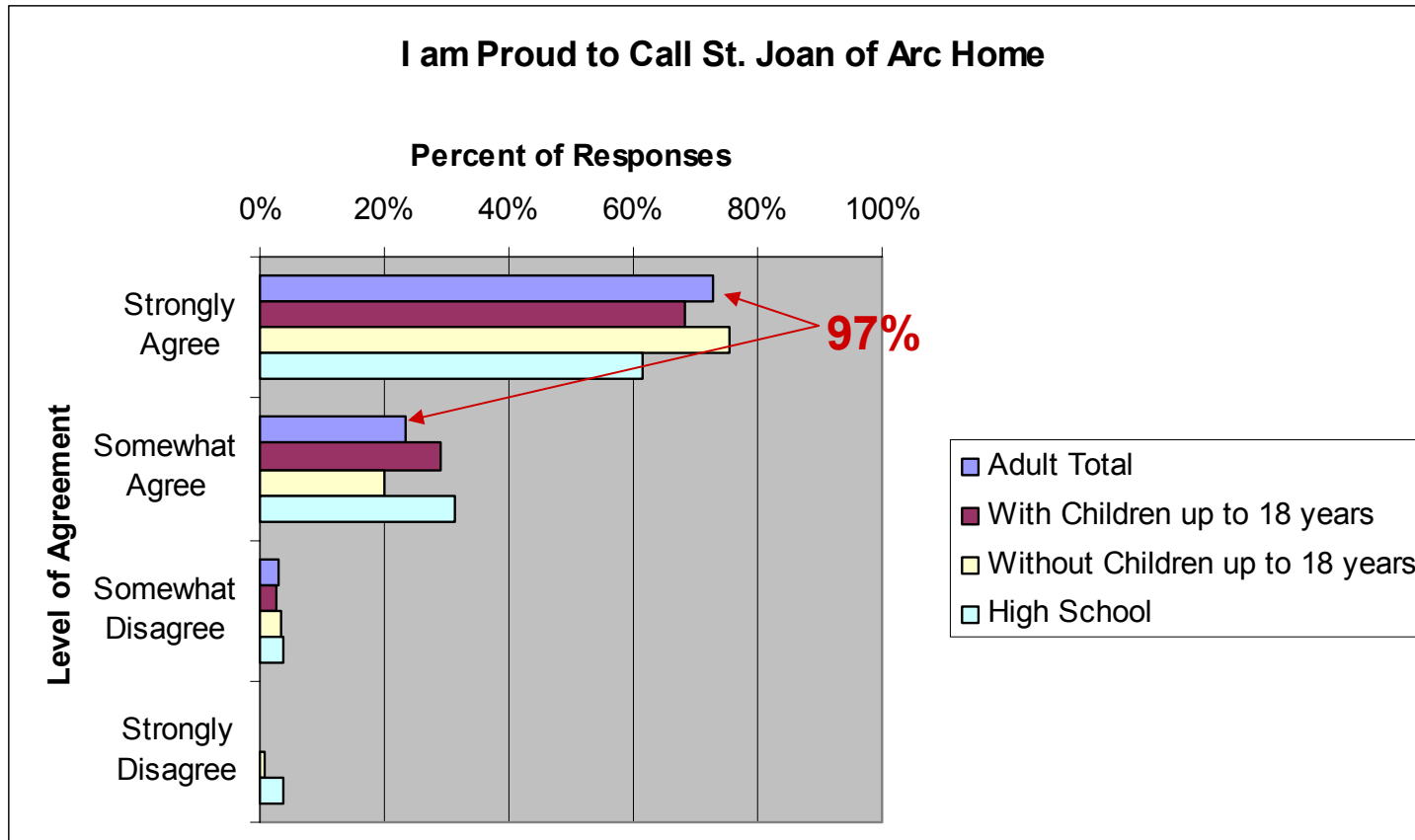

49) Overall, I am proud to call St. Joan of Arc Parish my faith home.

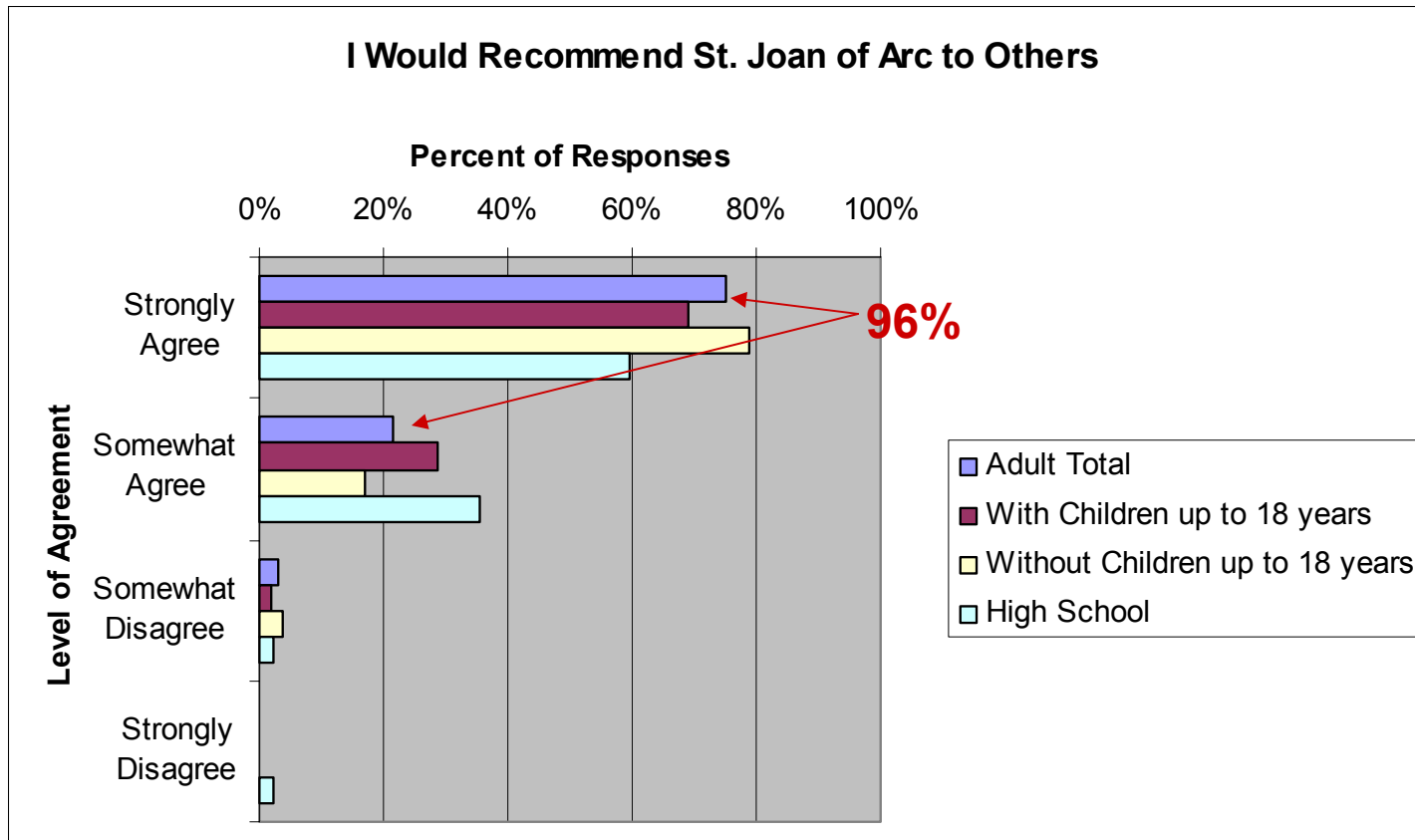


KEY POINTS

- 1) 97% are proud to call St. Joan of Arc home with 73% strongly agreeing. This is an excellent overall measure.
- 2) The High School value is only slightly lower at 92%.
- 3) Only 3 adults and 3 high school students strongly disagreed



50) I would recommend St. Joan of Arc Parish to others in the Kokomo community.

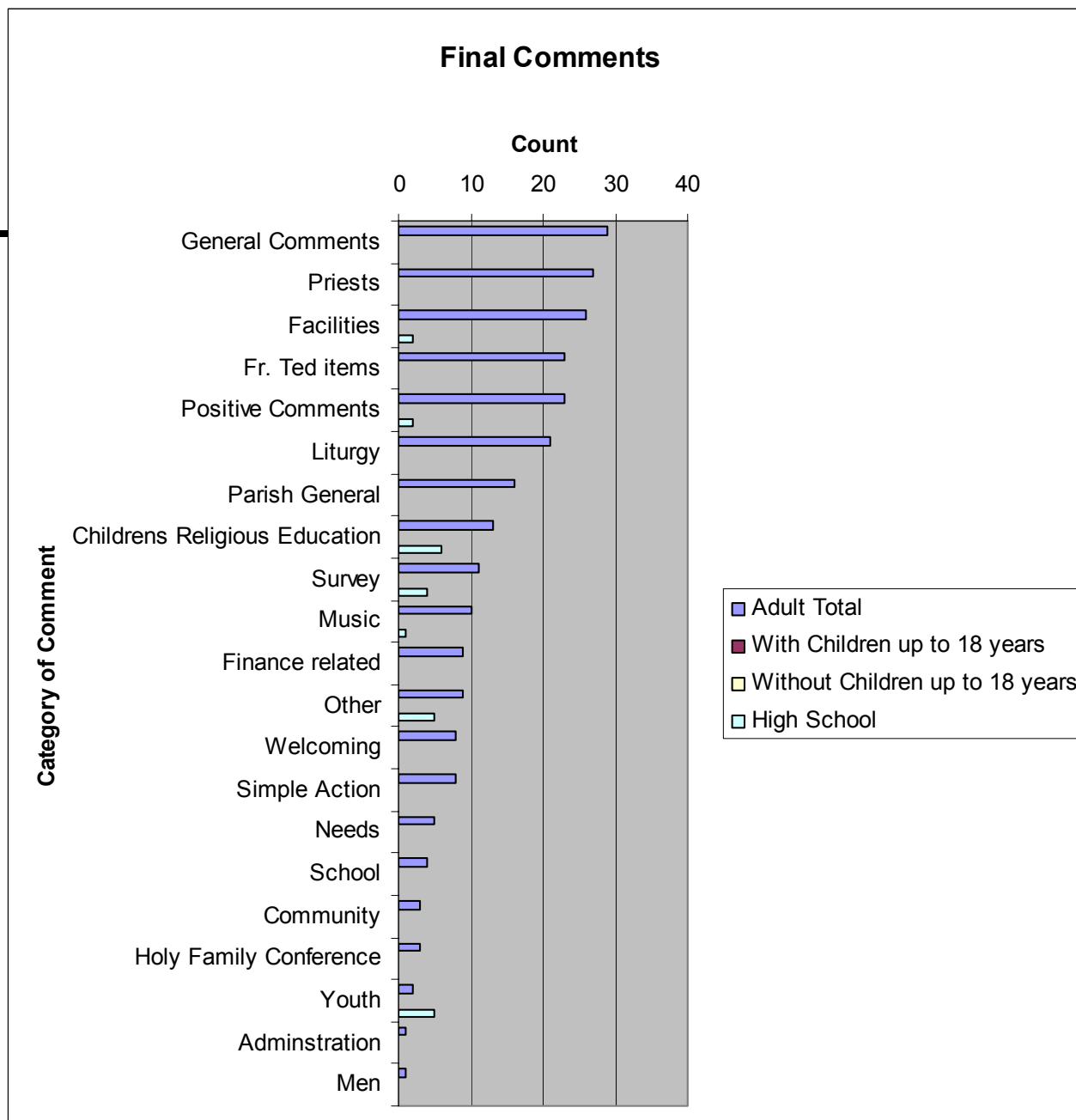


KEY POINTS

- 1) 96% would recommend St. Joan of Arc to others with 75% strongly agreeing.
- 2) The High School value is 95%
- 3) Again, this is an excellent overall assessment for St. Joan of Arc.
- 4) Only 3 adults and 2 high school students strongly disagreed

Overall Summary of Results

- We had excellent participation in the survey even though not everyone submitted a survey
